

## Warm Up


What do think about the book of Revelation? What worries you? What excites you?

## **Background and context**

Read the background booklet or the introduction to Revelation in the NIV Bible.

The first chapter of the book sets out the purpose of the book and reveals who Christ is in all His glory. Then chapters two and three reveal Jesus' message to specific churches in Asia Minor. They also speak to us today.

# Thinking it through: Main discussion/activity





- 1. Who is the book of Revelation about? What do we learn about Him?
- 2. Why does John call his experience a "testimony"?
- 3. Where is John when he writes down his experience? Why would this be important to his original readers?
- 4. Read Daniel 7:9-14. What connections do you see between Daniel's dream and John's vision? Why might this be important to John's original readers?
- 5. Read v17-18. What does Jesus say about Himself? Why is this important to the original readers?
- 6. Read v19-20. How do we know Jesus stands with the Church in times of suffering?
- 7. Read ch 2-3. The messages to the 7 churches. What does Jesus say is praiseworthy? In what ways does He challenge the churches?
- 8. How might these messages be for all churches everywhere in any time?

NB: use Tom Wright's book for additional questions and information in these chapters.

- 10. How can we apply what we have learned to our own lives today?
