# Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

with the help of Tim Keller Part II:



### How to obtain wisdom?

Last time we introduced what Biblical wisdom refers to in Proverbs, this time we will look at how we get it? The first thing to understand is that it is **'Step by step'**. There are no quick fixes and be wary of those in the world or church who offer them. Prov.3:6, reference to '*ways*' reminds us it is a daily step by step practice of the following

five principles found in Ch. 3 and elsewhere in Proverbs.

1. **Knowing God**. We need to daily determine to know God better and find ways to do that as it reminds us in v3 about God's instructions, *'bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart.'* 

2. A sober acceptance of yourself to avoid pride and stay in touch with reality, using **self-examination**. '*Do not lean on your own understanding*' (v5). Realising our shortcomings prepares us to accept God's love and guidance. God delights to use such people.

3. Appreciate the importance of **having good friends in the church** to counsel, discuss and mentor you and them. That is the value of joining a 'Life Group'. No lone rangers; God has put us in the community of the church. As it says at the beginning of Chapter 3:1, '*My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments*'. Be willing to listen to the good advice of others.

4. In addition to knowing God better, **put what He teaches in His Word into practice** *'in all your ways' (v6)* and learn how to live as a Christian - just as Peter encouraged his hearers to discipline their lives with good practices so they might be fruitful and 'see clearly'. (2Peter1:5-8).

5. Learn to **find God in trouble** as it reminds us in vv 11-12 '*My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline or be weary of His reproof, for the Lord reproves him whom He loves, as a father the son in whom he delights.*' God uses the trials of life for our benefit. That doesn't mean it is easy; it is very hard and at times we don't understand the injustices of life and what God is doing, as Job experienced, or the writer of Psalm 73 who was troubled with 'the success of the wicked' while he stayed obedient to God and suffered for it. In Prov 30:1-4 it mentions a wise man called Agur who faced such difficulties and asked questions of God. 'The words of *Agur son of Jakeh - an oracle. The man declares, ...* 

... Surely I am too stupid to be a man. I have not the understanding of a man. I have not learned wisdom, nor have I knowledge of the Holy One. Who has ascended to heaven and come down? Who has gathered the wind in His fists? Who has wrapped up the waters in a garment? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What is His name, and what is His son's name? Surely you know?'

Thankfully Jesus, the 'Wonderful Counsellor', helps us as He experienced suffering that He didn't deserve - for us. In John 3:13-14 He says, 'No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up.' Jesus pointed Nicodemus to that answer - using the same words Agur used in Prov.30:4, 'Who has ascended to heaven and come down?' - to help him make the connection. The one Agur was looking for 'from heaven' is Jesus and His suffering on the cross. If we see things from that perspective - as the troubled man in Psalm 73:16-17 found help when he 'went to the house of God' - and apply the lessons of the cross in our daily lives, it will help us make better sense of our difficulties and we will be following God's wisdom.

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# Endurance and Prayers for those who suffer

The popular slogan, "God will not give you more than you can handle," is not only a misinterpretation of scripture but can be a stumbling block to sufferers who are in situations they really cannot 'handle'.

When I hear this misleading slogan offered as some sort of consolation in prayer or conversation, I cannot help but counter it by using 2 scriptures in Corinthians; one where Paul is speaking about enduring our temptations to sin and another quite different one where he is speaking about enduring troubles.

In 1 Corinthians 10:13, Paul is talking specifically about the temptation to sin: "No temptation has overcome you except, what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so you can endure it".



By contrast, in 2 Corinthians 1:8-9 Paul speaks about his inability

to endure troubles that he really cannot handle - they were so bad that he despaired of life! Surely we have all been there at some time in our lives. Sometimes our life situations are simply that - unendurable and despair-inducing. "We do not want you to be uninformed brothers and sisters, about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death."

In temptation to sin, we are not tempted "beyond what we can bear." In other troubles, we may be faced with things "far beyond our ability to endure".

Mercifully, God offers us a "way out" when tested by the enticement to sin. What then does He offer us when our hardships are indeed more than we can handle?

I believe Paul gives us the answer to this as he continues in 2 Corinthians 1:9b: "But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead." In troubles which are 'more than we can handle', we need to press into God and keep on pressing into Him.

But not only that. Paul goes on to say how important the prayers of others are at such times: "He has delivered us from such a deadly peril and He will deliver us again. On Him we have set our hope that He will continue to deliver us, as you help us by your prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favour granted us in answer to the prayers of many." 2Corinthians1:10-11

I once met a man after church who was facing untold hardships. Someone had offered him the popular slogan above as a way of comfort but it had had the .....

..... opposite effect. It had sent him spiralling further downwards into despair and confusion as he tried to reconcile his intolerable and horrific suffering with God 'not giving him more than he could handle'. When he heard the 2 scriptures above, his sense of relief and release was immediate and immense.

Paul told Timothy to be a worker "who correctly handles the word of truth" (2 Tim 2:15). May God help us to do the same, that we may encourage and uphold one another in our times of need.

Following the **CAP** feature in last Sunday's service, we would like to thank you so much for your enthusiasm and responses - we were so encouraged.

As far as the Christmas hamper work is concerned, see below for the particular needs that we currently have. Please check the sign-up sheets in the Welcome Centre and sign up where you feel you can help out.

- we still have spaces for packers, as well as car drivers for the deliveries. Having a team mate for the drivers would also be helpful in case parking is tricky, or we can pair people up.
- Deliveries will be done during daylight hours on Thurs, Fri & Sat, 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> Dec, and will be grouped by area with each pair asked to deliver 6 or so parcels.
- We are aiming to include a full Christmas dinner with treats in each hamper and we will make up about 45. Last year, we sent out around 40 parcels, costing about £40 for single clients and £60 for families.
- Gifts of sweets or toiletries would be much appreciated. We will have a welcome centre collection point within a couple of weeks or so.

# Prayer Diary 11<sup>TH</sup> - 17<sup>TH</sup> Nov

**Monday** Today is Remembrance Day. Spend some time today thanking God for the sacrifice of those who have given their lives or their health in order to protect us. Pray for those who continue to suffer from the after-effects of war. Thank God that our country is at peace, and pray for areas of the world where there is conflict.

**Tuesday** Pray for those in Ukraine who are suffering the effects of war. Think of our friends in Lebedyn who are serving God faithfully under such difficult circumstances. Thank God for all that they are doing in their community. Pray especially today for the team. For strength and protection this week.

**Wednesday** As our friends in Lebedyn travel around the region, delivering food, aid and support to those in need, pray for their safety. Pray, also, for those they are serving: the elderly, vulnerable, refugees, orphaned and bereaved. Thank God for the work of the bakery which blesses so many people.

**Thursday** Pray that God will bring people to Him through the church services held at the centre in Lebedyn. Ask Him to soften people's hearts to accept Him as their Saviour as they accept the aid given to them.

**Friday** Pray for the children and young people engaging in their various activities at the centre. Thank God that so many are eager to study His Word and learn more about Him. Pray for those who have repented, that God will continue to work in their lives.

**Saturday** Pray for God to make **"wars cease to the ends of the earth".** So many people are suffering throughout the world as a result of war. Ask God to" **break the bow, shatter the spear and burn the shields with fire."** Pray that He will soften the hearts of those who are responsible for conflicts, and that God will bring His peace.

Sunday "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." As you prepare for church this morning, spend some time being still in the presence of God and waiting on Him. Thank Him for His blessings and His goodness and be ready to exalt Him today as we worship together as a church family.
