This has been a journey of over 3 years working with CAP to get to this point - we are constantly reminded of the resilience and determination of our clients in the face of so many difficulties. Please pray that they will find further hope in 2025.

We wanted to share with you a few other things to give thanks to God for:

- We have had 3 clients attend VBC in recent months, responding to our invitations to come along.
- We continue to offer prayer with each client and many accept and so we have had the privilege of praying with them.
- We have shared scriptures and Biblical stories too, when this has been appropriate.
- We have discussed an experience of deep peace one client had at a church event in their childhood.


The style of the service has been influenced by a group in their twenties and we hope to see young adults enjoying the evening service followed by hotdogs and drinks. The service is open to all ages.

Their Deeds will Follow Them

Two people died in the second half of last year who are worth taking note of. Timothy Dudley-Smith (TDS) on the 12th August, bishop and noted hymn writer, and

the centenarian Jimmy Carter, 29th December, 39th president of the United States. They have much to teach us from their beliefs, lives and calling.


TDS (born 26/12/26) was best known for his hymn writing, he wrote about four hundred, and was one of those who helped ignite the late twentieth century explosion in Christian song writing. Some of his better known hymns are: 'Tell out my soul', 'Lord of the years' and the Christmas carol, 'Holy child, how still you lie'. Not bad for a man who was not musical and dependant on others to



provide the tunes; most notably his life-long friend Michael Baughen, one time Rector of All Souls, Langham Place, London.

What he lacked in music, though, he made up for in choice of words and rhyme, which he was master of, using an elevated yet accessible diction that has a timeless quality and usually followed the ABAB rhyming meter. Above all, his hymns were Bible- based, Christ centred and joyful, reflecting his evangelical convictions.

He wrote many of his hymns on holiday in his beloved Cornwall, beside the sandy beaches near the Lizard, rising early to find inspiration and then join his family to surf on the waters. He gave himself wholeheartedly to writing Christian songs, describing it as 'the hymn writers privilege to offer to worshippers words in which to



clothe and express the aspirations and emotions of the heart.'

The other life worth pondering was Jimmy Carter (born 1/10/24), the peanut farmer from the small city of Plains, Georgia, who unashamedly declared his Baptist born again faith when becoming president, taking the oath on the Bible his mother gave him, reading from Micah 6:8, 'He has

told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?' and promising always 'to tell the American people the truth.'

He saw no obstacle to combining politics and faith declaring, 'You cannot divorce religious belief and public service. I've never detected any conflict between the two' though that was tested with his personal beliefs against abortion being different to the party line but he found his way through.

His four year presidency had its difficulties, especially with the economy and Iran but his most notable success was getting Sadat of Egypt and Begin of Israel to agree the Camp David Peace Accords in 1978 between their two countries.



That was a precursor to his post presidency work for peace and helping the poor internationally at the Carter Centre for which he became more famous and won the Nobel Peace prize in 2002, motivated by Jesus' words, 'Blessed are the peacemakers' (Matt 5:9).

In these endeavours he worked hard into old age alongside his wife Rosalynn with whom he shared 77 years of marriage. He returned to live in the same single-floor, 2 bed house he occupied before becoming president (its value less than the secret service vehicles parked outside to protect him) and taught Sunday School in the local Baptist Church. 'It was never my intention to be rich', he said and, true to his word, he never accepted any financial remuneration from talks and support he gave to different people and groups after leaving the White House. May God raise up other Christian politicians of such integrity and influence in our day.

Both men exemplified lives lived well, rooted and inspired by their Christian beliefs, using their gifts to glorify God and benefit their fellow man. Of such the scripture says, 'Blessed indeed are the dead who die in the Lord, that they may rest from their labours, for their deeds will follow them.' (Rev.14:13). May we be inspired to use the talents God gives us to show the same dedication.
