Remembrance

At this time of year our thoughts turn to remembrance. We reflect on the past and remember those who sacrificed their lives in wars so that we may enjoy life and freedom. We are asked to remember those fallen in Flanders fields and in other war zones. This year too, many will be remembering those lost to COVID. This is a difficult and troubling time of year for many people.

It is no coincidence that "remembrance" has many parallels to the gospel. We are asked to remember Jesus' sacrifice in a memorial meal. In fact the Bible asks us to remember many things. You will find out how many on Sunday! Fortunately I will be speaking about just THREE.

Remember your creator - Remember Lot's wife - and "Do this in remembrance of me."



At the end of the 10am service, we will be switching to the TV broadcast of the National Service of Remembrance, held at the Cenotaph on Whitehall, London, and observing the two-minute silence.

a passion for life

"God did this so that they would seek Him and perhaps reach out for Him and find Him, though He is not far from any of us."

Acts 17:27 (NIV)

This week in our afternoon service, we will be focusing on the key question: **Why should we journey with the people around us?**

This session aims to help us to see that God has placed everyone where they are in order that they would seek Him and find Him and to understand that God uses Christians in their unique circumstances to help people encounter Jesus.

There will be a video presentation and time for discussion and prayer. We hope that as many of you as possible will be able to join us. Those who have been able to attend so far have expressed how useful these sessions are.

If you are unable to make it this week, then here is a link to the video and a few questions for you to consider once you have watched it. Maybe you could discuss the questions with others.

- How does knowing God's aim for the world is for people to meet Jesus affect our thinking about the purpose of life?
- Think about the truth that God is the Creator, Sustainer and Ruler of your life, street and community. How does this give you confidence and what does that mean as you share Jesus with others?
- Focus on those who live near you. Think about the following: What do I know about them? What have I done to serve them? What can I do to serve them if I haven't done so already?

Finally, spend some time in prayer:

- Praise God that He is Creator, Sustainer and Ruler of the universe. Praise Him for
 His grace in saving us. Ask God to draw people around you to Himself and to help
 you be more willing to join in journeying with them towards life in Jesus.
- Ask God to help you to remember and see that nothing is an accident, God is in control of it all and has purposed you to meet and point others to Jesus.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

In October we were approached by the Well-being and Lifestyle coordinator at The Hawthorns, Independent Living Centre in Carew Road, asking if the church would be able to provide a Sunday service for them. There are one hundred residents at The Hawthorns. So this is a great opportunity for community outreach.



It is proposed that we offer a service

on a Sunday, once a month, between 4.30pm and 6.00pm. The service to last no more than 45 minutes.

The CLT have asked me to take this forward. We need to build a team of people who would be willing to take a turn at running a service so that nobody is committed to being available every time. Each service would need three people, plus a keyboard player. So, I am asking for volunteers please. If you feel this is something you could help with please be in touch with me. Perhaps some of the Life groups could take a turn at providing the service? If your Life group could help please let me know. If we get a good number of volunteers I envisage no-one would need to commit to more than twice a year.

Depending on volunteers and availability we may be able to do a 'one-off' before Christmas for them and then start properly in 2022.

Paula Burr

It has been my privilege to serve on the CLT for the past 3 years so I am standing for a second time to build on the work done with the team in that time to fulfil the vision of our church.

I have been a Christian since I was in my early-mid teens due to God working though the faithful ministry of Sunday School teachers, loving friends and some good Christian books at a challenging time in my life. This has involved

God with me in the many ups and downs through the changing seasons of life's journey.

I have been attending VBC since 2011 and became a member soon after that.

While attending Victoria I have been involved in the Worship team, Girls Brigade, Sunday School, Prayer Ministry, Ladies Soaking Group and have started leading a Life Group.

I work as a technical supervisor at Sussex University, am a trade union rep, and also involved in a mental health first aider network in my work place.

Other areas where I have had experience of governance in the past are Lewes and District Churches Together Homelink, diaconate at Newhaven Baptist Church, Breakout Community Trust (Newhaven) and a staff member of University of Sussex Council.

I believe God has called me to continue this work, relying on Him and trusting Him to lead us where He wants us to go together as His church.



Lucy Craggs

I grew up in a loving home in Willingdon, a butcher's daughter and youngest of three girls. I spent many fun days on the Brown family farm as a child and that's where I first heard about Jesus. I went on to study in Manchester and Innsbruck then started my career in recruitment in London. I returned to Eastbourne in my late twenties and trained as a primary school teacher. Both my sisters had been following Jesus and been praying for me for ten years. I was always interested in the life they led and the Jesus they followed and started attending VBC. I stepped



into the light and was full of joy, an indescribable joy! I prayed, started reading the Bible and attended an Alpha course. Having given my life to Jesus, I was baptised in early 2003. God has been faithful through challenging times and guided me at each crossroads since then. I met my husband Paul ...

... on the day I was baptised at VBC and we were married the following year. The Craggs family showed me how to be a Christian wife and mother. We are parents to three children and have been helped in our parenting by the church family and praying sisters in Christ. My Mum always helps those in need and inspires me to look to others. As a member of VBC I have been able to serve by running and teaching Sunday school, mentoring teenage girls, planning holiday clubs, arranging meals to be delivered to new parents in the community and facilitating parenting courses. I am now a trustee of two charities, including Eastbourne NetworX. I am passionate about the marginalised and lost as well as family life. I would be honoured to serve VBC as a part of the CLT; I am thankful so many in our church family have helped me grow in faith and showed me the character of Jesus.



Frances Hall

I was born and brought up in a small village near Sevenoaks in Kent. As a family we attended the little evangelical free church. I made a commitment to faith, giving my life to the Lord at the age of 11 and was baptised at around 17. Looking back I am so thankful to the people who faithfully gave their time to teaching and guiding me through Sunday school and youth work (I am still in touch with my Sunday school teacher to this day!) and through the ministry of the church. Having

worked in the leisure industry for 3 years following my degree, God clearly called me to work with profoundly disabled children. Having endeavoured to give and serve when and where I could within the restraints of work commitments, being now retired from teaching I hope that, by being a part of the CLT, I can support the nurturing and growth of God's people of all ages at Victoria so they too may benefit from input and provision in the same way.


RICHARD KIRK

1 Peter 3:11,2: "Search for peace, and work to maintain it. The eyes of the Lord watch over those who do right, and His ears are open to their prayers," (NLT)

Monday This week is Inter-faith week. Pray that by talking to people of different faiths this will bring understanding of other's views and promote what we believe to be the only true faith. Jesus's mission to the world was to break down divisions and encourage people to live in harmony together.

Tuesday Today is Pray for schools day, the aim of the organisation is to ensure that every school in the UK is prayed for by local Christians. Pray for the success of this mission and that many children will learn of Jesus through this work.

Wednesday Pray for all our members & friends who are unwell, that God's healing and comfort will be with them and their families supporting them during this time of concern. Pray also that the medics who treat them will be empowered with wisdom & compassion.
