Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

with the help of Tim Keller

Part 17: **The 2 Great Tests of Life**: **Prosperity** and **Disaster**

'Two things I ask of you; deny them not to me before I die: Remove far from me falsehood and lying; give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with the food that is needful for me, lest I be full and deny you and say, "Who is the Lord?" or lest I be poor and steal and profane the name of my God.' Prov. 30:7-9



- 1. How do you get on with tests? Their aim is to find out what you know. **God also tests us in two areas of life prosperity and suffering -** to see where our allegiance lies. Proverbs deals with these two scenarios because how we face them determines how wise we are. Eg. Prov. 3:5 challenges us to *'Trust in the Lord with all our hearts...'*, then, a few verses on, in 9-11 it describes two scenarios to test that: in prosperity when *'our barns are full..'* and in times of trial; how we respond to *'the Lord's discipline'*
- 2. The danger and challenge of prosperity is pride, when you exceed legitimate boundaries and think more highly of yourself than you ought as Nebuchadnezzar (see Daniel Ch.4) and the devil (see Is.14:12-15 a reference traditionally associated with him) did. It does not end well!
- 3. The danger in adversity is to become devastated when the person or thing we have put at the centre of our lives eg loved one, work, health etc is taken from us. This shows they have become our idols and taken a place in our hearts only God should fill.
- 4. What is the solution to these two tests of life? James sums it up well:

'Let the lowly brother boast in his exaltation, and the rich in his humiliation, because like a flower of the grass he will pass away.' (Ja.1:9-10)

- a. When we prosper we need to thank God and show humility.
- b. When adversity strikes we need to purposely remind ourselves of the good news and benefit the gospel message brings. This includes God's personal love and ...

... commitment to those who believe in Him, whom He endearingly calls His 'little children' (Jn.13:33) or 'little lambs' (Jn.21:15). Part of that love involves His 'disciplining' us for our benefit. In English the word has negative connotations but in Hebrew it denotes allowing specific suffering/pain to make us better people. This is what Paul discovered regarding his 'thorn in the flesh' (2Cor.12:7-10). It led him to be less conceited, to know God's power in weakness, the sufficiency of God's grace and a settled contentment and peace with his lot.

5. How do we make this real in our lives and apply it to our situations? By

reminding ourselves how Christ dealt with these 'two imposters of triumph and disaster' as Kipling called them. Jesus, as the perfect man, did not let success go to His head and, when He endured great suffering, He trusted God to help and deliver Him. The degree we recall and apply this, with the Holy Spirit's help, to our situation, it will help mould us to have the right attitude and be wise in this matter.

'Consider Him who endured from sinners such hostility against Himself, **so that you** may not grow weary or fainthearted.' Heb.12:3
