I have been a member of VBC for five years, together with my wife Rebekah and children Hannah and Peter.

I was born in Eastbourne and grew up in Old Town in a Christian family, attending Living Stones church. I can't remember a day that I didn't believe and trust in Jesus and I am grateful for the love and guidance of my parents and church family in bringing me up in the faith. An important step for me was when I was baptised at a church camp in the lake at Ashburnham Place when I was seventeen.

After studying maths at Bristol University, I volunteered for a couple of years at a Christian drug rehab centre in Hong Kong. Since then, I have worked

as an accountant, living in London (where I met Rebekah at an Anglican church) and Croydon (where, as a family, we attended a small Baptist church) before moving back to Eastbourne in 2019. Wherever I have lived I have always been involved in a local church, serving in different ways. I have also done some practical and theological training in my spare time (Equipped to Minister course at Spurgeon's College when we lived in Croydon, and more recently a Bible Training Course with the Sussex Gospel Partnership). I currently lead a life group with my wife Rebekah, I help with the youth and occasionally preach.

I was asked by a few members of the church to consider standing for the CLT. If elected, I pray that God will use me to serve Him in this role.

### Prayer Diary 18<sup>TH</sup> - 24<sup>TH</sup> Nov

**Monday** Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, Ephesians 6:18. Spend some time praying for all those who are part of VBC. Pray for the senior minister and the ministry team that they may know the Holy Spirit, empowering them to fulfil all that God wants them to do at VBC. Pray, too, for the staff who work hard to support the ministries and keep things running smoothly. Pray for the different areas of ministry – Men and Women's Fellowship, Women's Ministry, Children and Young People, CAP and the Community Fridge, Pastoral work, Outreach and Discipleship.

**Tuesday** The Word became flesh and blood and moved into the neighbourhood John 1:14. Pray for those who live near you that they may see Jesus in you in the way you act. Pray for opportunities to show them God's love. **Wednesday** I urge then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people, for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. 1 Timothy 2:1-2. Pray for our country, that God may be at work through those who govern us. Pray that God will give wisdom to those in positions of leadership and responsibility. Pray that they may exercise justice and compassion for the vulnerable. Pray that the laws passed in this country will be more in line with God's values.

On Friday, 29<sup>th</sup> November, MPs will vote on a Bill to legalise assisted suicide in England and Wales. Labour MP Kim Leadbeater has introduced the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill. It would allow adults diagnosed with a terminal illness and deemed to have up to six months to live to get help from doctors to kill themselves.

**Thursday** He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. Psalm 147:3. Pray for countries and communities where there is war. Thank God for the Centre in Lebedyn. Pray for Bohdan and the team, that God will renew their strength as many come for help and provisions. Pray that those who seek refuge will come to know the God who is their refuge. Pray for those who are traumatised by war and those who've been bereaved. Pray for world leaders that God will give them wisdom and concern for the people they serve. Pray that God will make the wars cease.

I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the alorious Friday Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation so that you may know Him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in His holy people, Ephesians 1:17-18. Pray for those recently baptised, that they may grow in grace and the knowledge of their Lord. Pray that God may strengthen them with His Spirit to face the challenges that will inevitably come. Pray for those who are struggling with issues they had before coming to Christ so that they may know the freedom that He brings. Pray that their roots may go deep down into His love and that they will grow strong and stable in a changing world through God's word of truth filling their minds and hearts.

**Saturday** You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of *Egypt. Deuteronomy 10:19* Thank God for all those who have been able to settle here, find a home and work, and be reunited with their families. Pray for Anna Reid and the work of NetworX in supporting refugees. Pray for those still waiting to be settled in homes or reunited with family members. Pray for those in Government with responsibility for policies about helping refugees so that their decisions may be just and compassionate. Pray for the well-being of those who have come from difficult situations in their home country.

Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or Sunday brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and in the age to come eternal life. Mark 10:29-30

We thank God that we are free to worship and meet. We are grateful for ready access to the bible and the freedom to live out our faith. Pray for those Christians in many countries of the world whose livelihood and even their very lives are at threat if they tell anyone that they are a Christian or are found reading a bible. Pray that God will give them courage and strength and that by their witness those who now persecute will come to believe in the God they oppose.

#### **THE Gathering** (from the Creative Writing Group)

I was ready and waiting when the first people arrived. As I stood at the door, they slowly made their way up the path. Some had walking sticks, others linking arms, while others had more sophisticated walking aids. Their physical appearance spoke of their advanced years. There was the woman whose back was bent, showing the affects of the crippling disease she endured.

Then there was the one who struggled to see and was being guided by a younger friend. As each one approached, I opened my arms to welcome them and gave them a warm embrace. They hugged me in return. Along came the woman who was confused, she was very agitated and I held her gently until she was calm.

There was almost a pattern to the arrivals as if a memo had been sent out telling people in which order they should arrive.. The next people were neither old nor young. Many of them came in twos, with a friend or a spouse. They were lighter on their feet and as I embraced them, they smiled and chatted. Then the couple came who had received heartbreaking news about their son's health. I held the wife in my arms and she clung to me. No words were spoken.

The next group were younger. Some were teenagers arriving in groups, talking to each other, mobile phones in their hands. Most of them waved and called "hello" to me, others mumbled and one or two kissed me on the cheek. There were those who arrived holding hands, engrossed in each other, almost missing the fact that I was standing there.

Then the families arrived. Children ran or skipped up the path. Some of the girls wore princess dresses while some of the boys were dressed as Batman or Superman or some other super hero. The children laughed and shouted and the parents carried the younger ones. The single mum arrived with three young children, one on her hip, one holding her leg and another holding her hand. She looked exhausted. The dad with his two young children arrived, hot and sweaty

from cycling. It was hard work cycling with a trailer attached. He carried a bag full of things young children might need. On his shoulders was the youngest one and the older one held his hand tightly.

A lone, elderly man arrived and took my hand and squeezed it. They were from all the countries of the UK, from Europe, from North



America, from South America, from Africa and from Asia. I looked at my watch and took my seat. It was time to worship with this diverse group of people. **My family.** 

'And let us consider how we may spur one another on towards love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching.'
