Prayer Diary 19th - 25th Aug

"We love because He first loved us." - 1 John 4:19

Monday Give thanks to God for opportunities over the summer to spend time with loved ones among our friends and families. Praise God for the time spent together at home or in the fresh air, in relaxation and for times of rest on holidays. Pray for those for whom times at home are a challenge and pray for peace to fall on those situations.

Tuesday Take a little time to reflect on the miracle of new life in families. Pray for a wonderfully made baby or young child you know and for their parents as they adjust to a new way of life with their precious gift. Pray for siblings, step families, single parents, adopted families and the wider families. Give thanks for love and pray for provision no matter the circumstances or how the family is made up.

Wednesday Lift to our loving heavenly father those who are struggling with old age. Pray that our elderly family members know they are loved and that they are supported physically and materially. Pray for those who find this a lonely time because of the loss of a life partner or because of family far away or separation due to disharmony. Ask God for compassion to help us see the needs of our grandparents.

Thursday As the exam results are arriving, pray for our young people. Pray that they know that we are not measured by data but by the hairs on our head and the precious love of God. Pray for those who are excited and looking forward to new opportunities ahead and lift up those who are disappointed and are rethinking their future. Pray that whatever the youngsters are doing they will be safe from the taunts, temptations and troubles of the world in which they live. Ask God for strength for our teenagers to stand firm in goodness and love.

Friday Pray for the new season ahead for families. Ask for wisdom for those who are off to pastures new, for peace for those worried about new schools, colleges, nurseries or jobs. Pray, too, for those who may be fearing an empty nest or those who find change a challenge.

Reserved

Many of you will have noticed that some months ago we started putting RESERVED signs on some of the seats for our Sunday morning services. Please note that they are there for a reason! There are some on the left-hand side (as you enter the sanctuary) where we encourage families with babies and toddlers to sit if they don't want to take advantage of our facilities downstairs.

And on the right-hand side, the back row, we also keep the seats reserved, predominantly for wheelchair users - at our peak we have had 4 wheelchairs at a service. These seats are very near an exit in the event of an



evacuation being necessary and so I would ask you not to use these seats when there are plenty of others available. We can usually gauge by 10.05 or so whether they will be needed and then - and only then - are we happy to release these seats to latecomers.

Finally, at all-age services, front rows on either side of the middle sections are reserved for the Brigades. Your cooperation would be much appreciated!

The Salvage Operation

Arriving at the Recycling Centre, a mother grabbed her bulging bags and ascended the metal steps to the huge household skip. Belinda was told to sit in the car. She watched her mother and to her amazement she saw something hanging out of the over-full bag. She couldn't believe it. It was *Ragdoll* — her very own rag doll! The child jumped out of the car, scrambled up the metal steps, grabbed the scruffy cast-off with two hands and pulled her out, just as the unwanted items were jettisoned into the waste recycling receptacle.

The little girl threw her arms round her special treasure and squeezed her tight. Then she looked hard at her. Her wool hair was all tangled and matted. Her face was dirty and her tiny hands were so torn and tattered. Belinda stuffed the doll's worn-out hands into the little patch pockets of her check dress, to hide them. Her back was all dusty because she had been laying in a dirty loft for a couple of years. With a wetwipe from the car, the youngster cleaned up the doll's stained clothes and her face and hugged her again and kissed her chubby cheeks.

The doll wasn't a pleasant sight – tattered and stained. She was thoroughly messed up. Nobody would look at her twice! But Belinda loved her, whatever she looked like. She cuddled her and whispered sweet nothings into her ear. She was so very happy to find that her 'precious', who had been lost, had now been found. She took her home and tucked her up in her own bed – what a find! She would never let her go. Salvaged!

And **so were we once**, fit only for garbage collection but we were found, salvaged, cleaned up and dearly loved. "Whoever comes to me I will never cast out" says Jesus. The greatest delight and utmost pleasure of Jesus is to save us, salvage us from destruction and find a place for us in His heart and a home for us in His church.

This describes many of us who attend the Women's Fellowship – a group of ladies much loved by Jesus, being changed by his matchless grace. Would you like to join us?
