The Acts of Faith and Love Romans 9:12-21

“Be devoted to one another in brotherly love.” (Romans 12:10)



Sermons don't change churches. Beliefs don't change character. What changes them both are decisions and actions. The movement from hearing to believing to obeying is the most important movement in the world.

It is perfectly possible to believe that God is real and still be as messed up, anxious and selfish as anyone else.

What changes stingy people into generous people is the commitment to acts of generosity. What changes anxious people into calm people is the commitment to acts of faith and love.

The passage we are considering today sets out the transforming, community building acts of the Christian life. We'll see practices expressing and embedding family love, spiritual fervour and faithful love for those who oppose us. These words (Romans 12:9-21) are vital and important words for us to take to heart and put into practice. They are the key to our joy and fruitfulness in mission.

PRAYER DIARY: 20TH–26TH June

Following the theme of Chris' message, the following prayers are based on Romans 12:9-21

Monday *"Love must be sincere ... be devoted to one another in love."* In a world full of broken relationships, let us demonstrate the love of Christ in all of our relationships – with family, friends, neighbours and work colleagues. Let us be salt and light, especially to those who are a million miles from You.

Tuesday *"Keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord"* Give us the enthusiasm and stamina – physical, mental and indeed spiritual – that we need to maintain our relationships. Help us to be positive in our outlook and, when things do get tough, help us to pray all the harder so that we may serve You with increased vigour, maintaining the joy that comes through our faith and trust in You.

Wednesday *"Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practise hospitality"*. Let us never forget those around us who are struggling to make ends meet. We thank You especially for the work of CAP, Foodbank and Community Fridge and the reminder that these initiatives bring us of our duty to help those less fortunate than ourselves.

Thursday *"Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn"* As a church family, we experience many highs and lows – the birth of a child or grandchild, exam success, significant birthdays and anniversaries – but also serious illnesses, the loss of a loved one or an unexpected diagnosis. A POSTSCRIPT TO ROMANS

As we have studied the message of Paul's Letter to the Romans in recent weeks, the parting words of John Robinson, senior pastor to the Pilgrim Fathers as they set sail from Plymouth on the Mayflower, come to mind. 'I am persuaded the Lord has yet more truth and light to break out of His Holy Word'. I think this is true for our

understanding of Paul's deeply theological writing, particularly as we read chapters nine to eleven. There is one very obvious truth which seems to me to underpin the Letter. I will call it Divine Selection. This section is where Paul addresses his own heritage. Selection is familiar to the modern mind since Natural Selection is a part of the school syllabus which we have come to accept. But for the Christian this has big problems for a feature of the Theory of Evolution is the avoidance of any need of God. However, at the very heart of the Bible story is Divine Selection and I suggest that Natural Selection is subject to Divine Selection before time began. 'In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. All things came into being through Him.' I have followed this train of thought on Sunday mornings as our Pastor has brought before us Paul's teaching and I want to suggest that Divine Selection is a thread which takes us through the Bible linking its many books in one, our Holy Bible.

Consider, Abel's sacrifice was acceptable to God and Cain's was not, no wonder, for God's choice brought to light the murder in Cain's heart. Crafty Jacob was God's choice to father Israel in preference to his older twin, bluff Esau who it seems valued a delicious roast more than his birthright sold for a single meal. God revealed to Samuel that David, the youngest of Jesse's sons, who was overlooked when the sons of Jesse were brought before Samuel, was God's choice to be king on the failure of Saul's reign rather than his older eligible brothers. There are many other examples of God's selection in the Old Testament.



Which brings me to the New Testament. It was on the Damascus Road that Jesus revealed Himself to Paul who was chosen to take the good news



..... of the gospel to the Gentiles. Paul was to write to the Roman Christians 'Faith comes through hearing, and hearing through the Word of God. For everyone who believes on the name of the Lord will be saved.' That is where we stand as Christians, chosen by God in response to His touch on our lives. I see God's choice as an embrace to all who come to the Saviour who gave His life on Calvary's cross that we might have life through faith in His name. We then are to live our lives in the light of this glorious gospel as Paul exhorts us so to do in the first two verses of Romans 12. In all Scripture you will be hard put to it to find a better summary of discipleship for modern Christians.



(Also read John 1:1-3, Romans 3:23, Luke 2:10 f, Acts 9:6,15, Romans 10:13,17)
