

Resurrection Day – 1 Corinthians 15:50-58 – So What?

"We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed – in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet." (1 Corinthians 15:51)

The morning Jesus was raised from the dead is the most important morning in the history of the world. What the disciples initially considered to be unthinkable, soon became the source of their greatest joy: Jesus was alive, sins could be forgiven, and death had been conquered.

Prayer Diary: 21st - 27th Apr

'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me.' John 14:1

Monday Thank You, Lord, for the joy of celebrating Your resurrection on Easter Sunday, as a family. As our risen Lord, we remember Your comforting words; 'I will come back and take you to be with me that you may also be where I am going.' John 14:3. May these words bring us peace and hope in the most challenging of days we may face.

Tuesday 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No-one comes to the Father except through me.' John 14:6. Praise You, Lord, for revealing to us our Heavenly Father and the way to Him. We pray for our neighbours, that they may know the truth and have an abundant life walking with You. Helps us, Lord, to share the truth with our friends and family.

Wednesday 'But the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.' John 14:26. Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs with the Help of Tim Keller

Part 13: Finding strength to carry on

'A bruised reed he will not break...' Matt.12:20

- 1. There is a danger as Christians of being too simplistic when trying to help others going through difficult times. The Bible acknowledges this difficulty and Proverbs in particular has much wisdom to understand the issues at stake and how best to respond.
- 2. It firstly recognises **how complex suffering can be** and it can't be solved by glib words, random Biblical verses or external factors alone. This is because of the different facets that can be



involved such as its depth, reaching our inner spirit and desire to live ('a crushed spirit who can bear?' 18:4), its uniqueness to the sufferer as well as physical, moral and philosophical aspects. The following verses from Proverbs illustrate each of these: 'Anxiety in a man's heart weighs him down, but a good word makes him glad.' 28:1. Guilt, real or imaginary, can dampen what little joy a person has, 'The wicked flee when no one pursues, but the righteous are bold as a lion.' 28:1 or as Paul put it, 'My conscience is clear but that does not make me innocent...' 1 Cor.4:4. There is loneliness to suffering to which it is dangerous to say, 'I know what that is like.' Even the sufferer might be struggling to make sense of it. 'The heart knows its own bitterness, and no stranger shares its joy.' 14:10. A feeling that life is meaningless, even at its best, and especially in the light of death. 'Even in laughter the heart may ache, and the end of joy may be grief.' (14:13) 3. How do we respond to such 'suffering' with its multifaceted causes for our own benefit and to help others? The Bible does not shy away from this complex challenge but seeks to answer it with a solution that goes to the heart of the problem and meets all those causes. Its answer is the cross of Christ and, especially, the one to be found there. In Genesis and Revelation we read of 'the tree of life' that God offers as a panacea for all our problems. Unfortunately, access to it is barred by the 'flaming sword of the cherubim' because of man's disobedience in the garden of Eden. However, Christ died on another tree; in the New Testament there is repeated reference to Jesus dying on a tree, synonymous with the cross, eg Acts 5:30, 10:39 & 1 Peter 2:24. There He experienced physical suffering, loneliness, emotional distress, spiritual separation from God i.e. all the complex aspects of suffering we noted earlier. In doing this He endured the Cherubim's sword of judgement to reconcile us to God and make a new way to the 'tree of life.' Our deepest longings find fulfilment 6 ... in that tree. 'Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a desire fulfilled is a tree of life.' (13:12) It is interesting to note that Proverbs is the only other book in the Bible where the 'tree of life' is mentioned. George Herbert captured the efficacy of the cross in one stanza of his poem on the passion of Christ -

O all ye who passe by, behold and see;

Man stole the fruit, but I must climbe the tree;

The tree of life to all, but onely me:' (That is, only Christ could do it!)

4. One final point; **this is no quick fix**. For this truth to be effective we need to keep reminding ourselves of the benefits of the cross and what Jesus did there. To help us, God has given the sacrament of the Lord's supper as a visual reminder and also a church family to get alongside and provide physical and verbal encouragement and teaching. Both minister to the inner being and heart of the problem. 'Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed.' (Ja.5:16). The degree to which we use these means of grace, the greater the effect will be. - Listen to the whole sermon at: The Wounded Spirit – Gospel in Life John Demetriou
