Amen.

Wednesday Father, thank You for placing us in this town for such a time as this. We believe this is no accident - in Your grace we are part of Your wonderful plan for the world and for Eastbourne. Help our church to be a light in dark places and a refuge for the weary, thereby seeing Jesus honoured in Eastbourne and beyond. Give us wisdom, generosity, and courage to serve the poor with humility and love, pointing always to the saving grace found only in Jesus Christ.

Thursday Hallelujah the Saviour is born! We celebrate today Your birth and the message of joy to the world. We pause for a moment and taste afresh the wonder of the meaning of this day. 

Fuel For Prayer

Prayer Diary: 29[™] December - 4[™] January

This week is often known as TWIXMAS, the time between Christmas and New Year. For some people, it can be a bit of downtime after the hustle and bustle of Christmas. For others, it is filled with visits to relatives and repeated family Christmas events. Yet for others, it can feel like time in the wilderness before returning to work or restoring the usual daily routines.

With these thoughts in mind, use this week to pray through the following themes, not in any particular order or on any day, but as you feel led.

Those who feel lost: Many in our church family have struggled this Christmas due to grief. It may have been the first Christmas without a loved one. Pray that the Lord will comfort them through His Spirit. Pray that friends and family step in to provide company and love. Pray that those we know who are grieving will find a new purpose and plan as God leads them into a new season of life.

Unity of our nation: As our MPs and national leaders take a Christmas break, pray that they may find Godly wisdom to lead this land. Whatever your political colour, pray for the government, the Prime Minister and his cabinet. Pray that in 2026 and beyond, compassion becomes the foundation for decision-making, and not economics or crowd pleasing. Pray that those who seek to destroy this nation through division and hatred are thwarted and that the name of Jesus is glorified and not used for political gain.

Peace: Our world is in turmoil with wars, strife, and tension across the globe. Pray that those genuinely seeking peace will carry influence in negotiations in Ukraine/Russia, Palestine/Israel, Yemen, Venezuela, India/Pakistan and so many more places. Pray that leaders seek guidance and take notice of their people. Pray that in places like Nigeria, where the church is under pressure and Christians are facing increased persecution, the Lord gives them peace and protection. Pray for changed hearts and peace to reign.

Family life: Christmas and New Year can be a very busy time for so many families, and this can sometimes lead to tensions and arguments. Pray that hearts remain soft and tempers under control. Pray that the message of Christmas, Jesus, the king born as a baby, remains in people's hearts all year and not just this week of celebration.

The Church: Pray for our church, the team and all those who help make the church function. Thank God that we have such amazing facilities, and thank God for the generosity of our members in giving to the recent Gift Day. Pray for the ministries of the church, such as Children's and Youth work, CAP, Community Fridge, Men's and Women's Fellowships, Pastoral team, Girl's Brigade, the Flower Ministry team, Flow Café, and so much more! Ask God to work in the hearts of all those who are part of the church, to fill them with His Spirit.






