John 14:15-27 – Hearts on Fire – Advocate 2.0

"I will ask the Father and He will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever – the Spirit of Truth." (John 14:16)

Last time we began a new series about the person and the work of the Holy Spirit. We began with Paul's prayer for the Ephesians (Eph. 3:14-21). We saw that the role of the Holy Spirit is to apply to our hearts the salvation that Jesus accomplished and the Father has planned. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we can experience the joy and confidence of this great salvation.

This week we'll look at some of the things Jesus taught about the Holy Spirit. We'll see together the importance of recognising that the Holy Spirit is a person rather than a power.

We'll consider the difference this makes to our prayers and expectations in the Christian life. We'll also ask why we need 'another advocate' when the one we have already appears to have done everything we need. Is something lacking in the work of our first advocate? And finally we'll see how the peace that Jesus promised His disciples, is the peace only the Holy Spirit can give.

Prayer Diary 22nD - 28TH January

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching ". Hebrews 10:25

Monday Lord, You instructed us "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" Matt 28:19. Thank You Father for the witness Erik showed in his recent trip to India. We pray for Your protection and guiding hand over those on mission serving You in other parts of the world.

RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES

The administrator will:

- maintain accurate and up-to-date accounts.
- provide the Charity Manager and treasurer with financial activity
 data at agreed intervals
- liaise with the charity's accountant on all relevant matters.
- oversee payroll and pension arrangements in conjunction with the charity's accountant.
- ensure the timely submission of financial data to the charity's accountant for the preparation of annual accounts.
- be responsible for the charity's day-to-day banking arrangements.
- assist with funding applications as appropriate.
- administer the Gift Aid arrangements on specified donations.
- undertake such other tasks as reasonably required by the Charity Manager and as are appropriate to the role.

FLOWER MINISTRY

Mainly for the benefit of newcomers, we thought it would be a good idea to explain the various stages involved in the VBC Flower Ministry - in the hope that some of you may well be inspired to volunteer your services and join one (or more) of the teams.



Rotas are drawn up every 6 months and the whole process can be broken down as follows -

Stage 1 - Donations - we have a list of Sunday dates for 2024 waiting to be filled! Speak to Chris McMahon to find out what dates are still available and the money can be given to Helen Dickson, Chris McMahon or dropped in to the office. The amount you give is entirely up to you but, to give you an idea, most people give between £30 and £50.

Stage 2 - the Arrangers. On a Friday or Saturday the person on duty buys the flowers and arranges them at the church. These are the flowers you see on display every Sunday.

Stage 3 - the Preparers (or Bunchers). This is a Monday morning task, usually carried out between 9am & 10am or thereabouts. The display is split into bunches, generally 4 - nicely wrapped with a text/message accompanying each bunch - and they are then ready for the final stage.

Stage 4 - the Deliverers - the bunches are usually ready for distribution by midmorning on the Monday and the person responsible for that day takes them to the relevant addresses to deliver them (Car essential!).

The list of recipients is produced in the office with a variety of reasons qualifying



people for a bunch - eg special birthday or anniversary, bereavement, special achievement, health issues, moving home, encouragement, new baby, appreciation etc.

Whilst it's always nice to see the display on a Sunday morning, there is a bigger picture behind the scenes and for many years now, the ministry has been much appreciated.

Volunteers are always very welcome - and even if you are pretty useless at arranging flowers, you might be able to help with distributing the bunches on a Monday morning. Or you might simply want to donate the money required - no horticultural expertise needed there!
