

Prayer Diary 22nd - 28TH July

As long as Moses held up his hands the Israelites were winning, but whenever he lowered his hands the Amalekites were winning. When Moses hands grew tired they got a stone and put it under him and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held his hands up, one on each side so that his hands remained steady until sunset. So Joshua overcame the Amalekite army with the sword. Ex 17:10-12

Monday Reading the above verse we see signs, wonders, miracles and team work! What a lot to pray into this week! Moses' leadership depended on his dependence on God. "Your young men shall see visions and your old men will dream dreams". Let us pray that God through His Spirit will enable all churches to move forward allowing God to take control of events with us as willing participants in His plans.

Tuesday When Solomon had finished building the temple he prayed to God begging the Lord to show up. He knew that his magnificent building was useless without God's presence. Eventually God responded "I have heard your prayers and have chosen this place for myself". Read 2 Chr 7:13,14. God makes an incredible promise to Solomon which is for us too. "When" the crisis comes, "if" we turn to God in prayer, "then" He promises three amazing blessings: 1) to hear our prayers - miraculous intervention 2) to forgive our sins - salvation for us and sanctification for the church 3) to heal our land - a promise of reconciliation, restoration and social transformation. Whatever is on your heart today, pray in the light of these promises.

Wednesday "Thy kingdom come!" God is busy building a new heaven and a new earth with His renewed church. God is healing the land because of our repentant integrity and humility. Pray today repenting of sin and to be set free from inner pride to the glory of God.

Thursday "Deliver us from evil" I call it everyday miracles. It's easy to forget that most miracles that take place in our daily lives are invisible: secret daily breakthroughs that protect our children, enlighten our politicians, change the hearts of men and protect us from something we did not know could have happened. Far more of our prayers are being answered than we will ever realise. God's goodness is all around us. Pray today that we will nurture a daily attitude of gratitude, and may He continue to bless us.

Friday With the Olympics this summer, please pray that Christians at the games will have the opportunity to reach non-believers with the gospel and that God will bless all endeavours.

Saturday Please pray about the USA presidential elections, that God will choose who leads the free world.

Sunday "Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of faith" Hebrews 12:1-2. Please pray for all believers to be freed from weariness with their Christian life and instead be filled with joy and faith for the journey ahead.

Have your say on proposed council tax relief for worstoff in Eastbourne

People across Eastbourne are being asked their views on a proposal to increase financial support for low-income families and residents in financial difficulty.

A consultation was launched last week and will run until 5pm on Monday, 30 September 2024, about a proposed new Council Tax Reduction Scheme for 2025/26.

The government has stopped the national Council Tax Benefit Scheme and since April 2013, local authorities have had to run their own schemes to help working age residents on a low income to pay their council tax. The government sets the rules for the help given to those of pension age.

Cllr Stephen Holt, Leader of Eastbourne Borough Council, said: "I hope as many people as possible take ongoing reality for thousands of families on low wages and in insecure work, we are committed to explorize options available to be this opportunity to give us their opinion about our themselves in the toughest of financial situations. "

If the changes are adopted it will result in a reduction in the council tax due to the council of over £114,000 per year. To offset this potential loss of income, the council would need to look for areas to reduce spending and generate income across its service.

The council's proposed scheme would reduce council tax bills for the worst-off working age people or those on the lowest incomes in the borough. It would also

remove the minimum income floor for the self-employed and there would be no minimum award value.

Cllr Daniel Butcher, Cabinet Member for Finance, said: "... I am pleased this scheme could mark the return of a lifeline for them. It is sorely needed in these difficult times."

The cost of the scheme is shared between the preceptors: Eastbourne Borough Council, East Sussex County Council, Sussex Police, and East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service in proportion to their share of council tax receipts.

Prayer Diary 29TH July - 4TH Aug

'But you, Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God. Slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.' Psalm 86:15

Monday 'Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.' Psalm 51:10. Bring to your prayers today our willingness for God to change our hearts and attitudes to what He desires for our lives. Think about those who are spiritually blind and how we can ask God to open their eyes to Him.

Tuesday 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.' Philippians 4:6. It is not just the big things we need to pray about, don't forget all the little things, which may seem inconsequential to you, but not to God. He wants to hear about everything that troubles you and your loved ones or things which have brought you joy.

Wednesday *'Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.' Romans 12:12.* Think about those who are serving a prison sentence, that they may be open to God meeting them where they are at. Also, of the daily struggles their families encounter.

Thursday Pray for those who are malnourished. Many countries in the world are suffering from famine and wars. Think also about children in this country who will be hungry over the school holidays as the cost-of-living continues to soar.

Friday Spend time praying for people who use their time to help others in life-threatening situations, where quick decisions need to be made for the safety of all concerned. Pray that they may have insight in these situations, strength to endure, and that they may find peace after serving during a traumatic event.

Saturday 'The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in Him and He helps me...' Psalm 28:7. Consider those who are persecuted for their faith in the Lord Jesus. Pray that God might sustain them as they walk with Him in their daily lives.

Sunday 'Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born from God and knows God.' 1 John 4:7 Let us reflect on God's love for us, to teach us to show His love to those around us. Pray that God will equip you to carry out His work.
