






Amazed by Jesus Mark 10:24-32

Tuesday: Ask God to protect the children from the trauma of the war. Pray for open hearts to receive the gospel as they attend the children's clubs and camps, and for them to feel safe in the knowledge of God's love for them. Pray for their parents as they try to support their children through these uncertain times.

Wednesday: Pray for the young people who are showing such hunger for Shostka God's Word, Remember Egor & Sasha in particular, who are studying the Bible Krolevets with Bohdan and hope to become pastors Konotop themselves.

Thursday: Ask for God's continued blessing on the ministries at the centre: the bakery, seed ministry, computer classes, blankets and sheets for the hospital, puppet ministry, and the distribution of aid. Thank God that, alongside these ministries, the Word of God is proclaimed.

Friday: Pray for the refugees arriving in Lebedyn, having lost everything. Thank God for the aid and support they receive from the team. Pray that accommodation and resources will be made available so that they can settle

Saturday: Pray for the Krasnopillya soldiers that Bohdan visits, that they will read the Bibles velyka they have been given and will be open to receiving the gospel. Thank God that Bohdan has a good relationship with the Commanders and pray that this will continue.

Sunday: Ask God to be present in any peace talks. Pray that the world leaders will be inclusive of President Zelensky in their negotiations and for Godly men and women to be among those at the table. Pray for wisdom for the leaders and for them to have hearts for peace and not for conflict and destruction.

Local Football and Faith

Football sometimes gives itself a bad name – overpaid players, bad-tempered super -stars disputing every referee's decision, crazy prices to watch the top teams... It's good to know, however, that here in our town is a beacon of light:

Eastbourne Borough FC, currently chasing promotion from the Vanarama National League South to the National League, have a Christian chaplain – local youth worker Ben West. Ben's dad, Alan, was a well-known professional footballer with an England under 23 cap and a successful career at Burnley, Milwall and Luton, where he played over 300 games and in later

years worked as the club chaplain. He also worked as a **chaplain at Luton Town** church minister.

Ben grew up in a Christian household with two passions, his faith and his football. He recently completed a course at the UK Chaplaincy and, having made himself known at the Eastbourne professional club, he has been welcomed as the club chaplain. The club's manager, Adam Murray, a man with a strong Christian

faith that he isn't shy of sharing, has been happy to involve Ben in many of the club's activities: joining in the dressing room prayer before the game; travelling with the team on the coach to away games; supporting training sessions; chatting with the club's team of employees —groundsman, cleaners, chefs, analysts, sports science expert, physio.

The Borough is a professional club with a professional team supporting the players, as well as a board of directors and an ongoing search for sponsors.

Ben is gradually building up a rapport with the players, of whom there's probably a hundred at the different levels. Somewhat to his surprise (but also great delight) most of the first team squad came to his first bible study. Without pushing himself, Ben is there for a coffee and a chat if desired.

Young men can find the life of a professional footballer challenging, often juggling the demands of a young family as well as keeping themselves physically and mentally fit, and often living far from the club they play for. A listening ear with someone not directly involved in the football itself, can be very helpful. ...

Football can be a cruel sport for some: a sudden injury putting a player out for many months or even ending a promising career; wondering why he or she doesn't have a regular starting slot in the first team; not being retained at the end of the season; struggling to find another club; a childhood dream seemingly in tatters.



What about the effect of the result of

the game on the players? A narrow win – good, but what about our goal difference? A draw – at least it's a point but could have been better. A defeat? Perhaps best if the chaplain isn't invited into the changing room after the game.

As well as the first team there's a women's team (at the time of writing top of their league) and an under 18 side – so, lots of players who might welcome a friendly ear at some point. The Borough prides itself on being a community-minded club, providing midweek social events and soccer camps in the school holidays for both boys and girls.

Ben regards his role in the club as a 'privilege' and a 'blessing'. He is also conscious that a new owner or manager could decide they no longer require the voluntary services of a chaplain. So, just like a player or a manager you could be given a sudden boot. Ben has this very strong faith and hopes that others of faith or none will pray for him and wish him well. He knows there's more to life than football.

Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

Part 8: Wisdom re. How to Manage Money and Possessions

(with the help of Tim Keller)

Chapter 11 and the rest of Proverbs has much to say about money, negatively and positively, and the Bible provides us with a wise attitude of how to handle it. 1. A number of verses in chapter 11 highlight the power, deception, misuse and

danger when we give money undue importance. Eg. verses 1,4,16,24,25, 26, 28.

2. Wealth creation is not wrong in itself and is part of the creation order found in Genesis. God created the world for good, to be stewarded and worked for man's benefit. "Those who work their land will have abundant food, but those who chase

fantasies have no sense." Prov. 12:11

3. The danger arises when selfishness and greed make us misuse wealth and we give it undue importance. It clouds our judgement and decision making, makes us proud, and harms ourselves and others "Wealth is worthless in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death." Prov. 11:4



4. Why is it so subtly overpowering like a drug?

It is because it appears to offer us something we, as humans, crave for- **significance and security**. "The wealth of the rich is their fortified city, but poverty is the ruin of the poor." Prov. 10:15. But the Biblical view is the opposite; money cannot buy you true significance and security, only God can, "The name of the Lord is a fortified tower; the righteous run to it and are safe." Prov. 18:10

5. That leads us to the question, 'How do we break the power of money over us? Firstly, **don't deny the problem**, especially in our Western materialistic society where it has a subtle hold on us. Realise it is an offence to God just as sexual sin is, though it might not be so obvious. "You cannot serve God and money" as our Lord said in Matt.6:24.

Secondly, **Grasp the generous scattering principle**, "One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want." Prov. 11:24. Generosity is encouraged in the Bible with a promise it will come back with a reward. But care is needed to understand this is not a mechanical formula to get rich or get outward blessing as that would be just another form of bondage. This generosity must come from the heart as Paul shows in 2 Cor. 8:9, when appealing for money. He does not appeal to the Corinthian's will or emotions but to their heart, which includes the mind in Jewish thinking. He reminds them of Jesus' ...

ultimate 'scattering'/giving out of Himself for us on the cross and the great harvest of believers He will have as a result. "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you by His poverty might become rich". He wants that to be their motivation, and ours also, for sacrificial living and thus break our entrapment to 'mammon'.
