Bekah Legg is the CEO of Restored, a Christian charity working to speak up about violence against women and equip the Church to stand against domestic abuse and with survivors. A survivor herself, Bekah is committed to helping other men and women find freedom and live life to the full.

A former teacher, youth worker and Church leader, Bekah managed the youth support line and relationship education programme for a sexual violence centre on the South Coast. She delivered sex and relationships workshops in secondary schools and with the local youth service.

Bekah has published papers and lectures on a biblical understanding of domestic abuse and gender-based violence and has spoken at the UN on the important role the Church can and does play in ending VAWG.

Together with her husband Steve, she has raised 5 daughters and fostered 4 boys. They used their sometimes crazy experience to inspire a series of devotional books for families to grow in faith together and talk about the stuff that matters.

The daughter, aged 11, of one of our members is the inspiration behind this appeal. She is in fact doing it for the 3rd year, how impressive is that! Please do what you can to support her efforts in some way and indeed to help those in Ukraine who are caught up in this war.



Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

Part 10: Pride (with the help of Tim Keller)

Whereas most modern attempts to live wisely depend on 'technique', the Book of Proverbs seeks to develop 'character traits' or 'right attitudes' such as self control and generosity to help us make those life discerning decisions. In this section we discover another helpful life outlook to counter the danger of pride.

1. What is pride? It is needing to feel better than others in some way by continually comparing yourself to them, putting them down and enjoying your advantage over them.



'Whoever derides their neighbour has no sense, but the one who has understanding holds their tongue.' (Prov.11:12)

2. What motivates pride? A hint comes from examining the Hebrew word for pride which is similar for the one used of God as the Supreme Being. It is making ourselves to be our own 'supreme being', a place only God should occupy. 'Be not wise in your own eyes.' (Prov. 3:7)

This reminds us of the Devil's sin when he 'said in his heart',

'I will ascend to heaven; above the stars of God, I will set my throne on high.....I will make myself like the Most High.' (Is.14:12-14)

Since Adam and Eve listened to him, man has followed their example.

3. As you can see from the quote above with **the predominance of 'I'**, pride makes us very self conscious and self centred. As Paul confessed before his conversion, 'I verily thought with <u>myself I</u> would do much against the name of Jesus of Nazareth.' (Acts 26:9 KJV). We don't want to listen to advice.

This temptation applies to those who are over confident as well as those of low esteem who can also have an **inverted type of pride** by overemphasising or delighting in their weakness, typical of Dickens' character Uriah Heep. Both are a type of pride.

4. The sad consequence of pride is that **it removes us increasingly from reality** because we don't listen to others, don't learn from mistakes and therefore distorts our view of life.

'The lamp of the wicked is sin.' (Prov. 21:4) The word 'lamp' is used metaphorically in the Bible to also refer to what we let into our lives to guide us eg Matt.6:22-24, 'The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!' and Jesus went on to warn us, 'You cannot serve two masters.'

5. Such an attitude is **not just damaging our character but also spiritually and for eternity** for God opposes the proud and is on the side of those low in spirit.

'For though the Lord is high, He regards the lowly, but the haughty He knows from afar.' (Ps.138:6)

6. What is the answer to such a mighty foe? Prov. 25:33 gives us a clue,

'The **fear of the Lord** is instruction in wisdom, and **humility** comes before honour.'

Firstly, realise humility is God's way. 'Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of God' (Matt.5:3). Right through the Bible we see God used the second rate, marginalised or unexpected people to achieve His purpose. He uses the younger brother instead of the older, eg David; the less attractive, eg Leah for the Messianic line; the foreigner eg Ruth; the socially unacceptable, eg Rahab the prostitute etc. Supremely, we see this in Christ coming as a weak babe, born into a poor family and living a simple



life and dying a criminal's death to fulfill God's purposes and make a way of salvation for us. We too, to enter God's way, have to humble ourselves, admit our sin and accept the Lordship of Christ.

Secondly, we must walk in the 'fear of the Lord' which means to joyfully remember the privileged position He has put us in because of Christ's work. This makes us less self centred or protective because we no longer have to put on a performance to prove ourselves or give us self worth as we realise it all comes from Christ as a gift. We are already 'seated with him at his right hand in the heavenly places.' (Eph.1:20)

Thank you for the teaching we have here at VBC and for the way in which we can study and learn together. Help us to learn more and more of your goodness and plan for salvation as we read about faithful prophets and those patriarchs that trusted in you. Open our eyes, Lord, to be refreshed, and given joy and wisdom as we study your Word.

Thursday I will declare your name to my people. As we seek to follow Christ's example, show us those who you would have us speak to; those who need to hear your message of hope, those who you have prepared to hear the Gospel message of salvation. Help us to be prepared to tell others of your great love. We pray for those who have not yet heard, we pray for those who are working on mission fields far from home, we give thanks for those who serve you faithfully so all will hear.

Friday The poor will eat and be satisfied. Lord, your world is broken by greed and waste. We pray for the hungry around the world and give thanks for the many organisations who seek to serve in areas of famine, poverty, oppression and injustice. We look forward to the time when there is no more pain and hunger, when you restore all things.

Saturday Dominion belongs to the Lord and He rules over the nations. When we watch the news, Heavenly Father we despair of the situations we see. Help us to be patient and diligent as we try to understand politics and policies. Forgive us Father when we have not been humble before you in our dealings with friends and family. Thank you that, in all the chaos, we can rest in the knowledge that you are Sovereign.

Sunday All the rich of the earth will feast and worship; all who go down to the dust will kneel before Him. Lord, we give thanks for the opportunity to worship you together in church and for the way it encourages us. We look forward to the time when all heaven and earth will bow down to you, will acknowledge your greatness, when Christ returns. Build our hope for the future, fix our eyes upon Jesus, remembering His great sacrifice foretold in this psalm.
