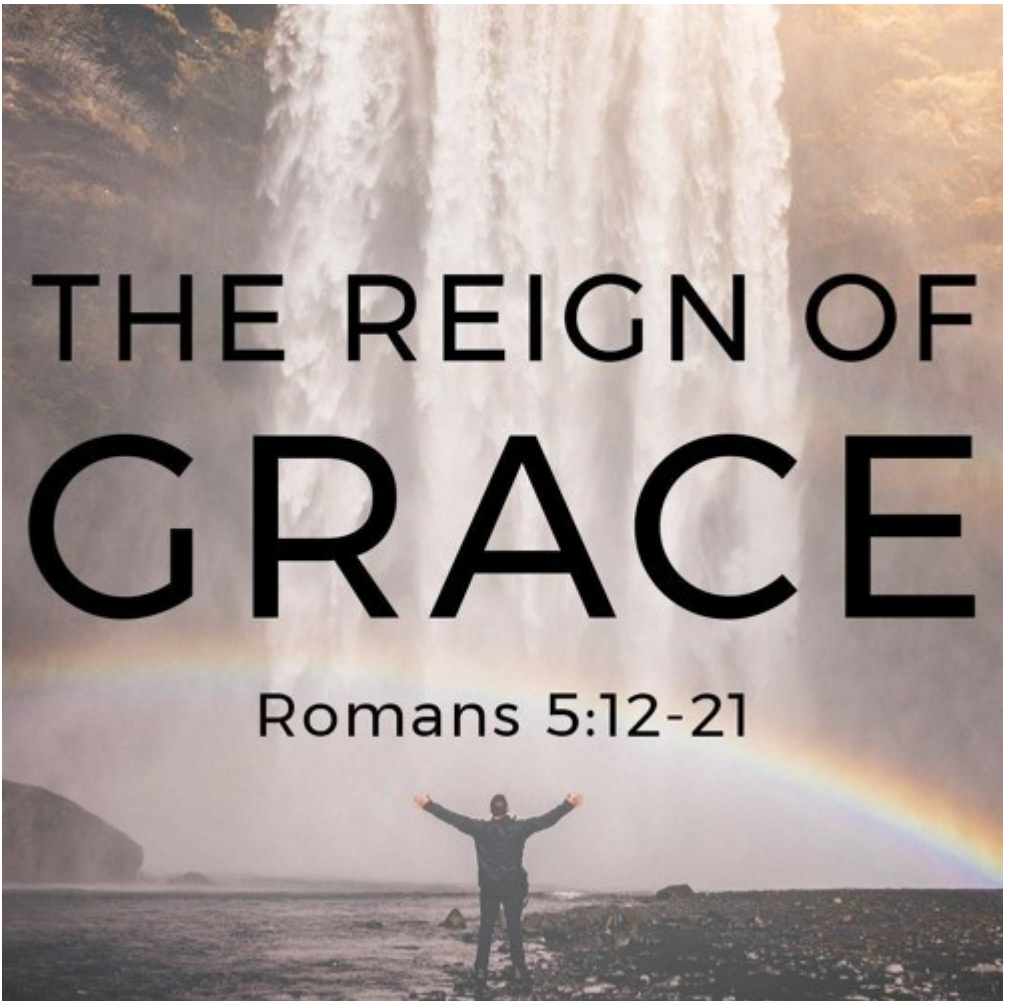

Romans 5:12-21

The Reign of Grace – Romans 5:12-21

Verse – “For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.” (Romans 5:19)

Jesus and Adam are the two most important people who ever lived. Adam is the head of the old creation. Jesus is the head of the new. Their actions had ramifications for everyone who followed them.

Adam had everything going for him. He knew that disobedience meant death but disobeyed anyway. We all lost with him. We lost our place in the Garden, we lost friendship and peace with God, inheriting a nature preferring our own wisdom over God's. Sin and death passed from Adam to us all.

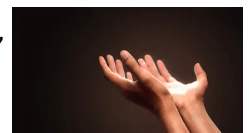
Jesus faced a different choice. This time it was obedience rather than disobedience that meant death but he obeyed! Just as the consequence of Adam's sin was ruin for those who belonged to Him, so the consequence of Jesus' obedience was life, hope and peace for those who belonged to Him.

Paul draws this comparison in Romans 5:12-21 to show the certainty that nothing will ever be able to separate believers from the love of God and the fulfilment of His good purposes in their lives.

A Joyful Weekend

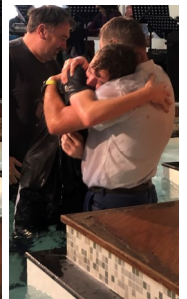

PRAYER DIARY: 25TH – 31ST OCTOBER

“Give thanks to the LORD, call on His name; make known among the nations what he has done...tell of His wonderful acts. Glory in His holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice. Look to the LORD and His strength; seek His face always” Psalm 145

Monday *“Blessed is the one who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners...their delight is in the law of the LORD.” Psalm 1.* In the aftermath of the tragic death of Sir David Amess MP, give thanks for those members who seek to uphold godly standards in both Houses of Parliament. Give thanks for his legacy of faithful service and pray for his family as they deal with the aftermath of his untimely death. Pray that all will be done to ensure the safety of all who seek to serve and be freely available in their communities.

Tuesday *“Blessed are all who fear the LORD, who walk in His ways...may you live to see your children’s children” Psalm 128.* In this half-term week for many, remember those with additional responsibilities with grandchildren or with their offspring. Pray for good bridges to be built between the generations and especially within the church. Remember our students studying away from home and the link-ups made between life groups and our school leavers. Pray that our young people will have the courage to always stand firm in their faith and also to experience the loving support of others whilst away from home.

Wednesday *“The LORD is near to all who call on Him, to all who call on Him in truth...He hears their cry and saves them” Psalm 145.* Pray for those who have come to realise that Jesus IS the Way, the Truth and the Life and are seeking to begin their road of discipleship. Pray that those attending the Alpha Course will discover them for themselves personally. Pray also for those recently baptised that they will stand firm in their daily witness for their Lord.

Thursday *“Praise be to the LORD my Rock...He is my loving God, my fortress, my stronghold and my deliverer, my shield in whom I take refuge” Psalm 144.* On Sunday we have a visit from Neil Hilton. Continue to uphold Him and Jess in their ministry with Good News Brighton. Remember also others serving the Lord elsewhere: Bayo and Deneese in Battersea; Emma in Gosport; Darren and Emily in Sidley, Bexhill; Carl and Chrissie in Sovereign Harbour. Pray that each of these friends will know the daily strengthening and enabling that the Lord alone can give, especially in any particularly demanding situations which they cannot easily share with others for confidential reasons.

FUEL FOR PRAYER

Friday *“I love the LORD for He heard my voice; He heard my cry for mercy. When I was in great need, He saved me...” Psalm 116.* Pray for our Street Pastors as they are out on patrol tonight. Pray for their safety and for continuing good relations with many of the night-time community of our town. Pray, too, for the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team, together with the crews of our local RNLI and Coastguards with their often difficult and traumatic calls to those who are in trouble. Pray that all necessary resources will be made available to them as they work to save and safely maintain the lives of others week by week.

Saturday *“The LORD watches over you – the LORD is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The LORD will keep you from all harm – He will watch over your coming and going both now and for evermore.” Psalm 121.* **Just a reminder that the clocks go back one hour tonight!** Pray for many of our older friends who live alone and who find that the longer and darker evenings can be an added source of concern. Pray for any known to you, that they might know the unseen presence of their Lord and Saviour and that they will be kept from all harm from malicious callers, especially those who plot to cause upset by scamming the most vulnerable. Remember the various support agencies, including the emergency services, Samaritans, Age UK, Victim Support and other local groups offering advice, support and solace to those who have become victims of crime in these times.

Sunday *“Blessed are those whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered...then I said ‘I will confess my transgressions to the LORD’ and You forgave the guilt of my sin. You are my hiding-place; You will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance.” Psalm 32.* Pray for the services taking place today including our afternoon Healing Service. Pray that God’s healing and wholeness might be experienced afresh by those attending and that folk will experience the freedom from past sins/actions that has been won for us through the victorious death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Pray also for the healing of past memories, affecting many still today, and remember all who are involved in any form of ministry on this Lord’s Day.

CLT Elections

Please remember that nomination papers are available for members who wish to put someone forward. The nomination must be returned by Wednesday 27th October. Please note “A nomination must be made by a minimum of two Church members who shall have ascertained that their nominee is willing to stand. This nominee must be a Church member and baptised by full immersion, aged twenty-one or over who has been in membership for at least two years. ...

Treebourne

We have been asked, as a church, if we would be interested in getting involved in a project this autumn/winter which will help to transform our town and benefit its residents.

Treebourne is a non-political organisation with a simple mission: to plant tens of thousands of trees in Eastbourne over the next decade. More than 6,000 saplings have been planted in 2020-21.



This is in fact a worldwide trend with there being support for tree planning among significant figures in the Church globally. In its September 9th e-newsletter, the Diocese of Chichester urged churches to back the campaign to plant trees to mark the Queen's platinum jubilee, a campaign launched by Prince Charles this year. We, of course, do have land here at VBC on which some saplings could be planted. But this is not just aimed at churches, but also at members of churches who would perhaps like to plant saplings in their gardens. Treebourne can help and it will cost you absolutely nothing. They will provide the trees free of charge. They can also provide some volunteers to help plant them.



Maybe there are community groups or schools or businesses in your area who might be interested in helping plant these trees. It could be a great way of reaching out to the community. Younger generations are passionate about the environment, and this could be a way of engaging with them by

showing that Christians care deeply about God's creation.

This endorsement for the project comes from a representative of the Anglican Church:

"Across the world Christians are committing to tree planting as a way to honour God and to make a difference in their community. Treebourne is a great example of what's possible. I would urge every church in Eastbourne to get involved."

*“Let us hold fast the confession of hope without wavering,
for he who promised is faithful.”*

Hebrews 10:23 (ESV)

This session aims to help us to think about how we can speak of the hope of the gospel amidst suffering; to see that our humility and vulnerability can help us connect with people and lead to opportunities to share the hope we have in Jesus.

There will be a video presentation and time for discussion and prayer. We hope that as many of you as possible will be able to join us. Those who have been able to attend so far have expressed how useful these sessions are.

- Did the pandemic present you with any opportunities to talk sensitively about your faith with someone else? Share your experience.
- Can you think of a time when suffering in your own life or in the life of someone you know was made bearable because of the hope you have in Jesus?
- Why do you think it might be helpful for others to see that Christians also suffer?
- How does the analogy of the boat help us in thinking how we can journey with people who are suffering?
- How does knowing that Jesus chose to experience suffering in order to save us, help us in our own suffering and help us explain the gospel to others?

Finally, spend some time in prayer:

- Thank God for His great mercy that has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Christ Jesus (1 Peter 1:3).
- Pray for any people you know who are experiencing personal suffering.
- Ask God to help you to be more open about your vulnerabilities, as well as more compassionate and willing to journey with people, and sensitively share the hope Jesus offers.
