

### Ephesians 6:10-18 – Baptism Service – Stand Firm "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power." (Eph 6:10)

This week we're celebrating three baptisms. Please pray for Charlene Morfil, Yanti Liao and Sepidah Kazemi as they prepare to tell the own stories of how God has brought them to faith in the Lord Jesus.

At the first baptismal class, with other believers attending for different reasons, we had people from China, South Africa, Columbia, Iran, Germany and the UK, all together. It is one of the great triumphs of the gospel that it reaches people in every part of the world and unites people from every culture in love for Jesus. He once said, to an entirely Jewish audience, "I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." (John 10:16). We only have to look at

our own church family to see how those words are being remarkably fulfilled.

The Bible passage we'll be reflecting on tells us that baptism is the entrance to a battlefield. It also tells us what God has provided to ensure we can be victorious in the Lord and in His mighty power.

Next Monday (26<sup>th</sup>) I start my training (50 hours) as the CAP Debt Centre Manager so I am ready to take over from Helen after Easter. I'm really looking forward to the role and continuing the CAP ministry to the next phase. For those of you who don't know me, my wife Shirley and I became members again at Victoria recently after moving back to Eastbourne some 27 years after we left because of my work. We grew up at Victoria, were baptised and married here, serving in different ways,

and are delighted to be back. Shirley has recently started a new job in Eastbourne as a Chiropractic Assistant and we have 2 adult daughters - Emily who lives in Ipswich and works supporting families with young children, and Chloe who lives in Worthing and whose main job is supporting a young person with special needs.

My working background, after graduating from Spurgeon's College with a degree in Theology, was supporting children, young people and their families with challenges to do with education. I started on the frontline doing case work before moving into management and then becoming Head of Service. Then for the last 20 years I have been working in Christian ministry, mainly in the role of Operations Director at two churches (Worthing and Ipswich) and currently I'm doing some part time project management work with a

some part time project management work with a Christian charity supporting refugees, and another Christian charity helping young people gain independence after leaving the care system in Kolkata, India. My role with CAP is 2 days a week so I shall be dovetailing it with my other roles. I'd appreciate your prayers for a smooth transition into the team, to quickly be able to engage and support the clients and to know God's guidance and grace in all I do.

#### The Comoros

Here at VBC, we have recently been privileged to hear from two people who work with the Persecuted Church throughout the world - Open Doors. They have compiled a list of 50 countries where Christians risk everything for Christ. In this list are two countries where I lived over 40 years ago. It would be tempting to think that these countries had 'moved on' since then but that is a doubtful conclusion. Let me share a small part of life in one of them - The Comoro Islands.

meant taking a huge risk with unknown consequences.



Where? They comprise four islands situated in the Indian Ocean roughly between Tanzania and Madagascar. Even before my time there, three of the islands were independent whilst the other had voted to stay under the umbrella of the French. God called me to one of the independent islands, Anjouan to do medical work. There was one small hospital for the whole island. If you are a squeamish person, maybe skipping the following description would be advisable! Hens wandered in and out of the ward areas, and drugs were given out once a day with no checks on when these were taken. The only bath should have been available for the patients but it was occupied by a coelacanth - a prehistoric fish kept in formalin and awaiting any museum who would take it away for a good price. There was no electricity at night and when I went to tube feed sick children late in the evening the myriad of cockroaches running over the cots might or might not scurry away. All Comorians were, and still must be, Muslims and to confess faith in Jesus Christ

Have you ever wondered why God allows an experience or situation where there seems no reason or explanation? After about 4 months our team had to be evacuated. The Comoros at that time was known as the coup capital. Unrest was

increasing as the Jeurnese group were becoming unpredictable and we were

Christians in a hostile Muslim environment.

I do not know or understand why God led me to the Comoros for such a brief time (I was committed to two years short term service) and why it was so abruptly ended. But I do know He

why it was so abruptly ended. But I do know He was faithful and gave me many experiences of His goodness and care day by day.

These thoughts I share for anyone who may be in a season of wondering why? God never makes mistakes. But He does ask us to

trust that His way is perfect even when we don't understand.

**Tuesday** "Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord." Ephesians 6:7 Many people serve our fellowship "behind the scenes." Their service can go unnoticed or taken for granted. Give thanks for our caretaker, Kevin, and for those who maintain and keep an eye on our properties. Give thanks for the many who exercise a ministry of intercessory prayer. May we all fulfil our God-given tasks whether upfront or behind the scenes this week.

**Wednesday** "Carry each other's burdens and in this way you will fulfil the law of Christ" Galatians 6:2. Uphold the work of our Life Groups ministering through personal contact this week. Remember those no longer able to attend regularly through frailty, advancing years or because of parental responsibilities or work patterns. Give thanks for modern means of communication by text, e-mail or phone to maintain these links and remember our students living away from home. Remember tonight's A.G.M. and Church Meeting.

**Thursday** "Be faithful unto death and receive your crown of life" Revelation 2:10 Remember the service of those working amongst our senior folk and especially all who are on the final lap of their earthly race. Pray for those contending with various forms of dementia, living with a terminal illness or for whom advancing years are bringing them frustration and the need to depend on the support of others. Remember those who care for loved ones at home.

Friday "It was He who gave gifts to mankind...to prepare all God's people for the work of Christian service..."Ephesians 4:12. Pray for all who have been given responsibility for the building up of God's people here at VBC. Those who preach/teach on Sundays and in the various children's and youth groups, those who disciple new Christians through Alpha; those who minister in practical ways through our CAP ministry and through Community Fridge on Wednesdays and in recognising and encouraging the equipping of all of God's people.

**Saturday** "We are partners working together for God, and you are God's field" 1 Corinthians 16:11. Remember the work and ministry in some of our local, smaller churches by some of our retired ministers. Pray, too, for the other churches of our Old Town group and the various ministries offered. Pray that all who gather for worship today will benefit from the fellowship shared and that " those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint". Isaiah 40: 31
