

R.E.S.P.E.C.T. - Romans 13

"Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honour, then honour." (Romans 13:7)

As we continue to consider the kind of living that constitutes 'true and proper worship' (12:1), we come to the matter of our relationships to those in authority over us.

Almost everyone in a position of authority today is subject to challenges to their authority. It is a mantra of modern life

that 'respect must be earned'. School-teachers hear it from students, police officers from the public and politicians from voters. The Bible, however, says something very different: Christians owe respect to all who are in positions of authority, whether they have earned it or not, because 'there is no authority except that which God has established.' (Rom. 13:1)

That raises some significant questions for us as we look out on a world in which the misuse and abuse of power is only rivalled by the incompetence of those exercising it. How should we think about these things? How should we live in order to please God? Should we ever oppose those in authority, and, if so, how? These are the things that we'll address together over the coming two weeks.

Prayer Diary 1: 27TH June – 3RD July

From Psalm 25

Monday: ["]In You, LORD my God, I put my trust." Let us thank God that HE is faithful and keeps His promises. All the ways of the LORD are loving and faithful toward those who keep the demands of His covenant. HE usually asks us to be obedient in some way as our part in this. Let us ask Him to show us if we are falling short anywhere, and affirming our trust in Him, ask Him to show us where we need to grow in grace and in our knowledge of Him.

Tuesday: "I trust in You; do not let me be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me. No one who hopes in You will ever be put to shame, but shame will come on those who are treacherous without cause. Our brothers and sisters in Lebedyn are having to trust in God in appalling circumstances. They are finding God faithful. Let us uphold them in prayer today, seeking God's protection, provision and peace for them. Believers in Russia have been lied to from the beginning. So, also uphold especially believers whose sons, brothers, husbands or fathers have not returned home from this "Special Exercise"!

Wednesday: "Show me Your ways, LORD, teach me Your paths. Guide me in Your truth and teach me, for You are God my Saviour, and my hope is in You all day long." Let us pray for all those who hear the gospel through the ministries of VBC. Those in the current and last Alpha courses; those who are witnessed to through Brigades; Mums and Toddlers; CAP; the Wednesday Fridge and food provision; the Fellowships for older people too. Let us use these verses to pray for leaders and visitors that all may know or come to know "You are my God and Saviour" and all that means.

Thursday: "Remember, LORD, Your great mercy and love, for they are from of old." Let us spend time to give thanks to God for His great love and mercy shown to each one of us. Then let us uphold those in need of particular mercy and love just now the bereaved; the sick in various treatments; those with chronic conditions that leave them fatigued and in pain; those whose families cause them heartache, and those still living in fear because of the media coverage of Covid.

Friday: "Do not remember the sins of my youth and rebellious ways; according to Your love remember me, for You, LORD, are good. Good and upright is the LORD; therefore instruct sinners in His ways. He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them His way." We who are older are aware of some of the temptations that Satan will use to pull children and young people away from their faith if they trust Jesus. Sadly, today's times are far worse than our parents could ever have imagined. Let us thank God for Erik and Simon, and all who volunteer to share God's truth with the children and young people VBC is blessed with. May our Abba give them wisdom and strength and energy for the tasks, and lives entrusted to them. Pray for every child and young person that comes into the building, that they will hear about, and put their trust in, Jesus as Saviour and Lord, and to be rooted and grounded in Him while they are young.

Saturday: "All the ways of the LORD are loving and faithful toward those who keep the demands of His covenant." Deliver Israel, O God, from all their troubles! Let us today, on the Jewish Sabbath, remember the command to pray for the peace of Jerusalem. We can thank God for the organisations and congregations where God has brought Jews, Arabic peoples, and Gentile believers together, to learn and worship in unity. They are now printing New Testaments in Israel, and it is online for the secret believers to read. But their government has collapsed, and as in our country, there are unacceptably sinful behaviours considered lawful in the land. So, please pray as God leads you.

Sunday: "Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted. Relieve the troubles of my heart and free me from my anguish. Look on my affliction and my distress and take away all my sin. See how numerous are my enemies and how fiercely they hate me! Guard my life and rescue me; do not let me be put to shame, for I take refuge in You. May integrity and uprightness protect me, because hope, LORD, is in You. There are lonely and afflicted in our church and in this land where people are being prosecuted for sharing Bible truth. They are being sacked and suspended from work and have to wait several years to see if courts will clear their names. Brothers and sisters around the world are being killed in great numbers, or imprisoned, just because they are Christian. As we rejoice in the freedom to worship together, please pray for those God lays on your heart today.

The Gospel Comes with a House Key


Book Review by John Demetriou

You might find this book a hard read. Not because it is difficult but because it appears extreme and unattainable. That would miss the author's purpose though and, more importantly, be an excuse to not practise a clear Biblical exhortation to use your home for God's service and spread the gospel.



Rosaria Butterfield shows how Christians have a unique great resource 'close to home' that they can utilise to benefit their neighbouring community socially and spiritually, which an official church does not have.

To perform this type of hospitality well she enumerates the following biblical attitudes as key to its success. The need to be: unpretentious, welcoming to all kinds of people, sacrificial, ready for some mess in your life, biblically rooted, practical and intentional. She is adamant you do not need a large home or facilities to do this well either. Rosaria illustrates those principles by describing how she, her family and other members of her church put them into practice in her local community, not hiding the difficulties they encountered or mistakes they made along the way as well as sharing the wonderful successes.



The book's style shows the author is well read and abreast of secular social trends, and has a teaching background, by the way she cleverly, pertinently and deftly intertwines and applies Biblical teaching with well-described, endearing and moving true life stories to illustrate her points.

The book is set in North Carolina, USA and there are a number of names and acronyms she uses from simple household goods to public welfare bodies that are lost on a non-American audience. A simple explanatory note appendaged to each would have helped the reader be more engaged and understand the context better.

With society becoming more insular and detached, this book highlights an important Biblical way Christians can reach out to their neighbours in

practical gospel living. Do you have the courage to read it and let it challenge you to play your part?

Miracles of Jesus

Even a blind man is made to see - John 9:1-12

Our Lord performed miracles to meet human need. Miracles are often a launch pad for a message conveying spiritual truth. His miracles were His "credentials" to prove that He was the Messiah. "The blind receive sight." Jesus used this miracle for a short sermon on spiritual blindness. (John 9:39–41)



I was reading recently that, in the United States, someone goes blind every twenty minutes!

The man we meet in this chapter was born blind. Just pause a moment. Born blind! Never seen his parents, never seen a baby's smile, never seen a beautiful flower, a daffodil, a rose. Never seen a beautiful sunset. For some reason, this blind man was chosen from others in the same group who were begging. An even greater miracle was the opening of his heart to the Saviour! He was willing to confess Jesus as the Son of God. (Luke 4 : 25 - 27)

Jesus selected this man. Apparently, the man and his parents were known in the community. It was on the Sabbath when Jesus healed the man. (John 9:14) Once again, Jesus was upsetting and challenging the religious leaders. (John 5:9)

The disciples did not look at this man as an object of mercy, but as a subject for theological discussion. The disciples were sure the man's blindness was caused by the sin of his parents, but Jesus disagreed with them. Only God knows why babies are born with disabilities. As far as we can see, what followed was at the Lord's initiative. It seemed that the blind man was quiet and passive while discussion about his condition took place. Jesus made no attempt to introduce Himself, to declare His role as Saviour and healer.

What about the Lord's method of healing? He began by spitting to make clay. He



used this method to heal a deaf man with a speech impediment. (Mark 7:32–37) He healed another blind man. (Mark 8:22–26) Some writers speak at length about the use of spittle. It is said to be a preservative against the poison of serpents, a protection against epilepsy.

Having had his eyes smeared with clay, the man was told by Jesus to wash in the pool of Siloam which was about half a mile from where Jesus encountered the blind man. This simple command to go and wash required a blind man to navigate through a festival packed city, and through narrow streets. He must have been inspired by the Lord's tone of voice to obey to walk with mud packs on his eyes. We can only imagine the emotions, confusion, amazement and overwhelming joy! "He came back seeing!" What a wonderful Saviour and He still heals today!

Prayer Diary 2: $4^{TH} - 10^{TH}$ July

"Whatever is true, whatever is honourable...just...pure...think about these things. What you have...heard and seen in me, do" Philippians 4:8-9.

Monday *"Be exalted, O God, above the heavens; let Your glory be over all the earth."* Psalm 57:5 Sadly there are few in our society that we can look up to as an example to follow. How we need to pray for all in positions of leadership, both secular and religious, that there might be a recognition that they need strength and inspiration, not their own, in order to discharge their God-given responsibilities. Pray that there will be a turning back to God and His commands in this country, and also in the USA as today they celebrate their Independence Day. Pray that the recent incidents involving multiple loss of life through the misuse of guns might not be downplayed/minimised yet again.

Tuesday *"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with very much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much."* Luke 16:10 Pray for all involved in the judicial system in this country. As barristers join the list of those adopting strike action, pray against any misuse of the system and for the many that are still awaiting justice for crimes committed agsinst them. Uphold our police force locally, our Police Crime Commissioner and all who hold high ranking positions that they might lead by example and also have the resources needed to maintain law and order.

Wednesday *"Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God".* Matthew 5:8 Purity in all areas of life has visibly been corroded over recent years. Pray for our young people that they won't be influenced by today's culture/lifestyle where impurity reigns unchallenged. Pray against the prolific exploitation of the vulnerable, and against trafficking and other forms of modern day slavery where the dignity of the individual is at risk. Pray for those who have been victims of abuse and for the healing of past memories.

Thursday *"My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry."* Revelation 2:11. Pray for lessons to be learned through good communication at all levels of society. Pray, especially in our church life, that we will take time to listen firstly to God's voice; then to the wisdom of experience of "the saints" in our midst. Pray that we will not ignore the voices of the silent majority, nor of those who are slow to speak. May we always hear another's point of view before imposing our own. Pray for those on CLT as they represent all areas of church life that they might be able to reflect/discern the way forward best for all.

Friday "Consider Him who endured such opposition from sinful men so that you will not grow weary and lose heart" Hebrews 12:3 Pray for those who are nearing the end of their earthly race and whose situations have become a burden and wearisome to them. Pray that we will enable them to continue to look to Jesus as the author and finisher of their faith. Remember, too, the many persecuted Christians who face opposition from the authorities or endure torture or unfair imprisonment and whose whereabouts is unknown to their families. Remember the many displaced families from the Ukraine and the countless situations where the father is away fighting and where the mother is left with full family responsibilities.

Saturday *"I rejoiced with those who said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD' ".* Psalm 122:1. Pray for all who have responsibilities in leading worship tomorrow whether here at VBC or led elsewhere by some of our retired ministers. Remember also Bayo at Battersea Chapel; Emma at Waterfront, Gosport; Darren at Freedom Church, Sidley. Pray for those who have still to make the transition from worshipping at home rather than in the company of God's people. Pray for our children and young people who will be attending tomorrow's All Age service and for any parents facing a reluctance to attend from their offspring. Pray with expectation for tomorrow's ministry and that it might be an encounter with the Living God.

Sunday "May the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing His will, and may He work in us what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen". Hebrews 13: 20-21. Commit the coming week to the Lord, asking that you might be open to His leading each and every day, prepared to be obedient to the Spirit's prompting, and enabled to bring light into the darkened lives of many with whom you will rub shoulders. May this be a week totally given over to the Lord, and may we then be able to look back with thankfulness for "all that the Lord has done for/through us."


The notes for July onwards have been delivered and are ready for collection for those who have ordered them. They are available from Sandra or in the office, where a card machine is available (payment by card is preferred).




A BUSY WEEK!
