Thank You for the hope of the perishable becoming imperishable, the dishonoured being raised in glory, weakness becoming power. We struggle, Lord, to understand the impact of Your resurrection. Help us to trust in Your unfailing Word, in Your great love and the hope we have in You. Thank You that when the trumpet sounds we will be raised with You. Help us Lord.

Sunday v25 Righteous Father, though the world does not know You, I know You and they know that You have sent me. Help us Lord, to draw near and learn more today. We worship You in unity, our great, righteous, loving God. Help us Lord to fix our eyes on Jesus, to continue to give thanks for His sacrifice made for all times and for all people. Help us to rejoice with others around the world because of our Salvation. May the message we hear today help us to make You known to others.

We also need 3 single bed bases with "as new" mattresses if possible, 2 bedside cabinets, 2 chests of drawers, small desks and chairs, bedside lamps and waste bins. Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs with the Help of Tim Keller

Part 14: Guidance: Which Way?



What an important subject to understand and get right for Christians, as there are pitfalls to avoid and this subject has caused much confusion. Proverbs provides some helpful lessons on how to be wise regarding this subject.

1. First, some Biblical foundational ground rules. The Bible teaches two apparently opposite mentalities in

Proverbs that are relevant (a paradox). On the one hand, we are responsible for our actions and it is unbiblical to have a fatalistic/passive attitude to life where we just say, 'It is all in God's hands so we don't make an effort to change things'. No, the Bible teaches, we are meant to take responsibility, use our minds and act wisely, including when making decisions. 'The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance, but everyone who is hasty comes only to poverty.' (21:5). On the other hand, the Bible also teaches God's sovereignty in our affairs. 'The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps.' (16:9) 'The Lord has made everything for its purpose, even the wicked for the day of trouble.' Even in our sorrows and difficult times God is working out His purposes. The key to wisdom when seeking guidance therefore is to apply both aspects in our thinking and practice.

2. How does this work out in practice?

a. There is a cost to it. We must be prepared to surrender to God's will wherever He takes us and accept whatever situation we find ourselves in, whether good or bad. This is the deeper meaning many miss from the verse in 16:3 'Commit your way to the Lord, and your plans will be established.' A superficial reading sees us bringing our plans to God for blessing and us benefitting, but it has the opposite meaning. We need to come to God completely open to how and where He will lead us. It's people with that attitude whom God will help. An example of this is Paul in the New Testament. Before, as Saul, his plans were self-centred. 'I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth' (Acts 26:9 KJV) but how different he was after his conversion on the road to Damascus. We find him subdued and 'behold, he is praying' (Acts 9:11) waiting and now open for God to guide him.

b. Because of the two foundational Biblical principles mentioned in 1 above, we must not be afraid to make our own decisions! God expects this of us rather than waiting for some big feeling or sign etc. Proverbs message is that the wise man who lives close to God can be trusted to make wise decisions and we need not be afraid to take on this responsibility because we know God is sovereign and working out His purposes. An example in the New Testament is when Paul, as a prisoner, on his way to Rome by ship, was involved in a storm. God had shown him through an angel that he and all on board would be safe but it did not stop him acting, using his

initiative, to stop the sailors getting away or encouraging them to take heart and have some food (Acts 27:21-36).

- c. We can also get advice and test our ideas, by discussing them with other mature Christians to help us 'The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice.' (12:15)
- 3. Where can we find help to trust God implicitly, realising how weak we are? Our faith in Jesus covers our shortcomings. The New Testament teaches, 'He who did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will



He not also with him graciously give us all things?' (Rom. 8:32) The more we understand this truth the **more confident we can be** to make difficult decisions because we know a Sovereign God is with us and has our good at heart. Joseph discovered this, after his long ordeal of hardships, when he told his brothers, 'You intended to harm me but God meant it for good' (Gen.50:20) or when Thomas asked Jesus, 'How can we know the way?' and Jesus replied, 'I am the way....' John 14:5-6. May we have the courage and faith to do likewise.
