
Just imagine what Sunday morning services would be like without our technical team providing their expertise each week!

Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs (with the Help of Tim Keller!)



The late Tim Keller did a series on Proverbs at Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City a few years back. I came across it a few months ago and thought it would be worth sharing some of the talks. 'Wisdom' is something we all need, to deal with different perplexing issues in life. I have made a summary of the main points that struck me from his sermons and will include a link

at the end to the actual talk which I recommend you hear to get the full benefit of the subject dealt with.

Part I: Introducing Biblical Wisdom

"My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God." Proverbs 2:1-5

Proverbs speaks of 'wisdom', something we all need in life. We can have knowledge, experience, an ethical code to live by etc, but for many situations it's

wisdom we also need: to know how life works, make the right choices and be competent in the realities of life. In Proverbs, wisdom is personified and the book is addressed to 'my son' from a mentor teacher, set in a school for boys/young men. We often just read snippets from the book but it was meant to be read and understood as a



whole to get the full benefit for 'wise living.' The early chapters (1-9) lay down general principles, the following chapters (10-15) reveal the benefit of wise living but then come chapters containing anomalies where despite 'righteous living' things don't go to plan and it doesn't always lead to a benefit. This is something Job discovered and many parents, who despite bringing children up in a Godly way, find they still go astray. Life is messy and doesn't always follow 'the rules for a successful life' but the message of Proverbs is that God is still there and we can find ...


a way through. We mustn't just take individual verses from Proverbs and apply them alone; that is too simplistic. We need to see the overall message of the book.

What is it? The clue is found in the poetic device the writer uses of personifying wisdom, often referred to as a 'she' in the Book while the one addressed, as has been mentioned, is described as a male. The answer is not just to follow the rules for Godly living but to seek 'wisdom' and know it as a friend or lover and as a

relationship (see for example Chapters

4,8&9).

In the light of this, we find the New Testament teaches Jesus is our 'wisdom' - 1Cor.1:30-31- and in the first chapter of John, the 'Word' can be interpreted as God's Wisdom, 'who came and dwelt amongst us'. In Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus invites us 'to come to Him and find rest, to take up His yoke and burden and learn from Him.' Faith in a person - Jesus - is



our wisdom because He lived the perfect life we cannot live, He took the punishment we deserve on the cross, and He gives us His Holy Spirit to come alongside and guide us how to live in this messy world. If we realise this, it takes the burden from us to have to prove ourselves and also keeps us from pride and feeling superior. When things turn out differently to what we expect we can trust in His 'wisdom' for we know He cares for us. This helps us to face the challenges and vagaries of life calmly, confidently and even joyfully. In the following weeks, we shall see how the Book of Proverbs and Jesus help us to obtain this wisdom and apply it to different areas of our lives.
