

Titus 3:1-8 – Hearts on Fire – Supernatural

"He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Saviour." (Titus 3:6)

How familiar are you with the book of Titus? If you're not familiar, you're missing a treat. I remember trying to read Titus, as a young Christian, and never getting past the first chapter. 'Appointing elders' and 'silencing the circumcision group' didn't seem the most scintillating spiritual stuff. However, chapters 2 and 3 are pure gold.

If you want to understand the gospel, there's no better place to begin than in Titus 2 & 3. Four verses in chapter 2 (v11-14) give us as succinct, yet comprehensive, an account of the gospel as we can find anywhere. Chapter 3 shows us the difference it makes.



This week we're going to look at the second of those passages and, together, learn how the power that will transform the whole world, when Jesus returns, has already performed that work in our hearts.

If you're able to make it, I hope to see you there.

27 Jan 2023 – A coincidence, or was it!?

The loss of my wife, Veronica, was a devastating blow to me. Although she had Parkinsons in addition to a weak heart condition, the end, when it came it came,

was a shock. A friend said to me, 'You know you will see her again' and I tried to believe that. But I lacked that assurance. My faith has known its highs and lows over the years. During a very low period (about 30yrs ago) I had placed all my Christian books in a suitcase in the loft and almost forgotten them. For some strange reason, I cannot explain, I decided to get them down and give them to BookAid, soon after Veronica had passed away. I had forgotten what was in the



case and was surprised to find a small booklet given to Veronica at her baptism, at age 14, on the 27th Jan 1952. Lying in bed that night, suddenly the significance struck me – WOW! Baptism symbolising going down into a grave and coming up to a new life, and now the Lord was showing me so clearly what He had done for Veronica exactly 71 years later to the day. He knew my unstable faith, unlike Veronica's which was firm to the end, and graciously chose a wonderful way to tell me that He had 'done all things well'!

Coincidence? I don't think so!

Prayer Diary 29TH January - 4TH February

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philipians 4:6

Monday Anxiety - Lord we pray for those who are overwhelmed by anxiety and mental health issues. We pray against this grip by Satan to disrupt the peace that you desire for us. We pray for those anxious about money and thank you for CAP and the relief it offers. We pray for those anxious about where food, shelter and other necessities will come from and we ask you to prompt us to be your hands and feet and pray for and support the work of Networx and Community Fridge.

Tuesday <u>Situations</u> – we ask Father God for those facing seemingly impossible situations to know Your peace.
