The Sermon on the Mount Matthew 5:33-48

"Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (v48)

Last week, Derek Page showed us the first three ways to be perfect – prioritising peace, purity and faithfulness in our relationships. As much as we might agree in principle, we are forced to confess that, if this is what God would have us be, we are a long way from what we should be. As Derek said, "The heart of the problem is the problem of the heart."



This week we'll look at the second three ways to be perfect. It's not difficult to see what Jesus says the commandments require – honesty, generosity and indiscriminating love for people. None of these are hard things to understand and yet all of them find us out. We're not perfect as our Father in heaven is perfect.

The good news, however, is that Jesus is perfect and gave Himself that we might be counted perfect immediately and become perfect gradually. That's the joy and journey of the Christian life. I hope you'll be able to join us this Mother's Day as we consider it together.



Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

Part 11: The Blessing of Work (with the help of Tim Keller)

Work is often seen as a chore to be endured and avoided BUT the Bible's perspective on it is very different. From the beginning of the world it is seen as something good, beneficial and to be enjoyed. How can that be? Let's see what Proverbs and the Bible teach on the subject to help us be wise about our work.

1. It's worth noting, God and Jesus both work. God in creating the world, 'Rested on the seventh day from all His work that He had done' (Gen. 2:2). "My Father', said Jesus, 'is always at His work.... and I too am working" (Jn. 5:17). God was not afraid to get His hands dirty when He created man from the



dust of the ground, Jesus worked first as a carpenter, then as an itinerant preacher, healer and worker for our salvation and Paul also worked 'night and day' for the sake of the gospel. Work existed in the Garden of Eden before the fall so we must start by saying it is a good and valuable thing for people to work and bad if they don't. This applies to all work, paid or unpaid.

- 2. The Bible teaches there is a variety of work and God gives us different skills or gifts to practice. "Do you see a man skilful (gifted) in his work? He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men" (Prov. 22:29). As it is God who provides this 'skill', understanding this makes us realise it is a spiritual gifting and whether you are cooking or teaching the Bible it has great worth in God's eyes. As George Herbert put it, 'Teach me, my God and King in all things Thee to see......Who sweeps a room, as for Thy laws, makes that and the action fine.'
- 3. It's important you use your 'skill', however high or lowly, with all care and diligence to be effective and God honouring. "A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich" (Prov. 10:4). 'Slack' here refers to a loosely tied bow that when used will miss the mark.
- 4. We should work, using the gift God gave us, not for selfish ends but to benefit others/our community, even if it sometimes means 'taking a hit.' Prov.8:1-4 speaks of wisdom calling out in the public squares, gates and the highest place in the city, having an influence on all aspects of a working city. The effect of the politicians and lay people who worked hard to abolish slavery in Britain in 1833 meant the country had to pay a huge price in compensating those who ran businesses with slaves and in the subsequent hike in food prices. Their motivation was not financial gain but the dignity of all men regardless of colour based on their Christian beliefs.
- 5. How is this possible when you consider how difficult work is with all the many things that can go wrong and thwart our plans? The Bible is realistic and realises ... 10

this. "The way of the sluggard is **blocked with thorns**, but the path of the upright is a highway" (Prov. 15:19). After the Fall, God cursed the ground and made work difficult because of 'thorns' (Gen 3:17-19), hardships, which both the believer and unbeliever have to face in their working life. Thankfully, God has provided a cure. In Jesus we are made 'upright' and He has cleared our path. He became a 'curse' for us on the cross (Gal.3:13) and bore the 'thorns', spiritually and physically, in His life and passion so we can live a life working for Him now, whose "yoke is easy, his burden is light and we can find rest for our souls" (Matt.11:28-39). Therefore, look forward to joyfully using your skills to help others, knowing you are serving Christ, the King of Kings, and He will reward you.
