PRAYER DIARY: 1ST – 7TH AUGUST

Monday 1 Timothy 4:4 *“For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving.”* Pray for the mess of the created world at the moment as we see the impact of climate change. Ask God that the work of the researchers will be blessed and that the voices of the scientists will be heard and acted upon. Pray for farmers working in changed circumstances and that they will have perseverance in the difficulties.

Tuesday 1 John 3:17-18 *“But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.”* Pray for those people in the world who are climate refugees - who have no way of growing or harvesting to feed families. Pray for the children who are starving because of the situation. Give thanks for campaigning charities and the relief agencies who are working with local people to improve the situation.

Wednesday Isaiah 24:4-6 *“The earth mourns and withers; the world languishes and withers; the highest people of the earth languish. The earth lies defiled under its inhabitants; for they have transgressed the laws, violated the statutes, broken the everlasting covenant.”* Continue to pray about the war in Ukraine and the way in which the most vulnerable are affected by the impact war is having on grain distribution. Pray that the ships will be able to leave and that the new harvest will be gathered despite the ongoing conflict.

Thursday Colossians 1:16-17 *“For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities - all things were created through Him and for Him.”* Pray for our local council and those that work to keep our environment clean and in order. Give thanks for those who work in the refuse and water industries. Pray for those around the world that don't have clean water or any sanitation.

Friday Nehemiah 9:6 *“You are the LORD, You alone. You have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them; and You preserve all of them; and the host of heaven worships You.”* Reflect a while on the impact we can have at home and in our own lives on reducing, re-using and recycling. Look for ways in which we can make an individual difference or change and ask God to put these measures on your heart as a joyful sacrifice.

Saturday Genesis 2:15 *“The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it.”* Lift to God those who are facing fuel poverty as prices rise. Ask that some long term positives will come from using less petrol, oil and coal and that we learn lessons for the future to reduce our carbon footprint and to share resources with compassion. Pray for governments trying to balance immediate crises with long term sustainability. Pray for integrity in leadership around the world and that their eyes will be focussed on the good of all.

Sunday Revelation 21:1 *“Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more.”* Rejoice and give thanks because, despite the doom and gloom, our Lord is sovereign. He has the whole world in His hands and He loves and cares for us. Ask God for His love to flow more and more into yourself, our church and community and that the message of hope will be heard.
