

1 Corinthians 12:1-31 - Hearts on Fire - Spiritual Gifts

"Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good." (1Cor. 12:7)

This week we're continuing our series *Hearts on Fire* by turning to the subject of spiritual gifts. It's a subject that can raise anxiety levels among Christians.

Theological books have been written arguing that the gifts died out with the apostles. Though most ministers haven't found the theological arguments very compelling, they can sympathize with the pastoral concern surrounding spiritual gifts.

Many years ago I asked a friend, who was a minister, what

he thought about them and he said: "If it was my church I wouldn't have them but it's not my church. I'm just a servant who's passing through." I've always found that helpful. Though it is true that spiritual gifts can be divisive and disruptive in a church, it does appear that God gives gifts to equip and enable every Christian to contribute significantly, in a variety of ways, to the church's mission of making disciples.

This morning we'll look at 1 Corinthians 12 and, God willing, uncover some beneficial truths about spiritual gifts.

Importance of Hospitality Sam. 17:27-29 & 1Ki. 2:7



I would like to talk about the importance of hospitality as a Christian virtue, using Barzillai, in this story, as a good example of this practice. To set the scene, King David is getting on in years and his son Absalom has rebelled against him, usurping the throne. David is fleeing for his life with a few loyal supporters, tired and

vulnerable. He has arrived in Mahanaim in Gilead, just across the Jordan in the SE corner of the country. At this time, people of influence were choosing which side to follow - either the dashing, young, friendly Absalom, who promised them so much and, with growing support, had taken control of Jerusalem - or the weak David on the run BUT still, importantly, God's choice as king and with the High Priest's support as well as his faithful troops. Barzillai, a local man, chooses to side with David and in so doing shows his faith in God but what can this 'very old man' do to help? He uses his wealth to provide David and his retinue with board and lodging in a friendly place to help them find rest, regroup, and be ready to face the enemy afresh. And we know, from the later account, they were able to quell the rebellion, restore David to the throne and, significantly, Barzillai's family is well treated by David and Solomon in future events, 1Ki.2:7.

Let us now look at what the New Testament has to say about HOSPITALITY by taking the three references to it there and learning something from each using Biblical examples to illustrate the points. Before that, it's worth considering what the original Greek word, 'Philoxenia' implies. It literally means, 'to show friendship to the stranger', comprising not just food but a friendly atmosphere also.

A. Heb.13:2 'Do not <u>neglect</u> to show hospitality to <u>strangers</u> for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.'

Here we learn two important aspects - it particularly applies to strangers; and it is something we have a duty to do. It could be strangers in church, our neighbourhood, our block of flats or care home etc. We need to look out for such 'strangers' and make them welcome. In the Old Testament, one of the best examples of this is in Gen. 18 with Abraham welcoming the three visitors (two angels & God!) who foretold the birth of their son in their old age.

B. 1Peter 4:9 'Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.'

This highlights an important aspect of hospitality concerning our 'motivation'. God does not want us to do things mechanically. There is no merit in that. He longs for us to be changed inside and have a 'willing spirit' of service as shown by His Son, Jesus. This does not come naturally to us, but as Christians we have learnt that we were once strangers and enemies to God and He took us into His family. We should



do the same. 'Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of His household.' Eph 2:19 Remember the Widow of Zarephath provided hospitality to Elijah during the time of drought. She and her son were on the point of starvation but we are told

after she was asked by Elijah to provide him with food, 'she went away and did as Elijah had told her', 1Ki.17:7-24. God is no man's debtor and He provided for her as He will for us if we obey Him.

C. Rom.12:13 'Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practise hospitality.'

What strikes us here are the two verbs, 'to share' and 'to practise'. Christianity is about sharing what we have, whether plenty or little, and about repeating the act of hospitality throughout our lives. 'Practice makes master'; improving all the time and learning from mistakes. This was the habit of the early church, 'breaking bread and eating together in their homes', Acts 2:46 and exemplified in the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus in Bethany. It is likely Jesus and His disciples often stopped there when near Jerusalem and enjoyed the company, friendship and food this family gave Him, especially just before His passion. Lk. 10:38, Jn. 11 & 12:1-3

We live in a fallen world of selfishness and greed where there are many lonely people, as well as those going through difficult times. One of the practical ways we can show our Christian witness is by using our home, or where we stay, or go to church, to welcome others, including strangers, providing a listening ear and friendship, encouraging words, especially from Scripture, and some refreshment. Then, when we stand before the Lord at the Judgement we will hear Jesus say, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance of the kingdomfor I was a stranger and you invited me in.' Math. 25:31-46.

Prayer Diary 4TH - 10TH March


FLOWER MINISTRY
