He sent His son to release us from slavery to sin, to pay off the debt so we can be free.

In our passage this week we find the Israelites in a hopeless situation, trapped by the Egyptians and seemingly doomed to death or captivity. God steps in and rescues them dramatically. The story is a picture of what Christ would later do for the whole of humanity.

## Prayer Diary 4<sup>TH</sup> - 10<sup>TH</sup> Nov

My word that goes out from my mouth, he says, will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purposes for which I sent it. Isaiah 55:11

**Monday** Meditating on the above verse, we pray to You God that nothing we sow for You will ever be wasted - no prayer, act of kindness or sacrifice. We praise You that although a seed may be buried for a while, it will come to fruition in due season. Amen. In Revelation beginning at 5:8 we read that 24 elders in heaven are holding bowls full of the prayers of God's people, ready to be poured out at the end of the age. This is a powerful reassurance that even though we may think prayers have been unanswered, they have in fact been cherished by God and await a fulfilment to come. Father God, I give you back the prayers that have not yet been answered. Restore the years, the prayers, the trust that the locusts have eaten. Help me to trust You again in my life.

**Tuesday** A prayer of John Wesley – Father God we pray that we will do all the good we can, by all the means we can, in all the ways we can, in all the places we can, at all the times we can, to all the people we can as long as ever we can. Amen. Christ says – It is mine, over all the earth. He is sovereign.

**Wednesday** We thank You Father for the radical example of John Wesley. We pray that You will raise up men and women in our generation to be Christian leaders and ministers who pray and preach with the passion that he did guided by Your Spirit and who will witness signs and wonders following the transformations of whole communities for Christ.

**Thursday** John 17:15 says – My prayer is not that you take them out of the world, but that you protect them from the evil one. Lord, we pray protection for all missionaries, in the broadest sense of the word, including those involved in CAP ministry, discipleship leaders, ministry to women in our church, and all missionaries working abroad; as well as each of us witnessing for Christ in our places of work.

**Friday** "the wind blows wherever it pleases ... so it is with everyone born of the Spirit" John 3:8. We pray for the church in our country and the whole world not to become self-absorbed or misguided in its direction, but pure and holy so that God reveals to the church where He is working and that the church will choose only to go where God is leading. We ask this particularly for the Church of England that is so publicly represented in our national life and has great influence on the views of Christ in our nation through TV coverage.

**Saturday** Ask God to strengthen and protect Christians in prison in Iran for their faith. In July Iran elected a more moderate president in Masoud Pezeshkian. Pray that he will improve religious freedom during his presidential term. Also pray that God will protect Christians who have fled Iran and that He will strengthen their faith.

**Sunday** Come, now is the time to worship. Lord, we give You our hearts, we confess You are God, we repent of our sins, we bow humbly before You and we choose you now. We pray that we will come into Your house with clean hands today for this is Your house and You are a holy God. We ask all these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

### DGH Chaplaincy Team Appeal

Our hospital is probably the place with the highest concentration of spiritual concerns in the whole area, yet if we are honest, we in the churches seem to be somewhat unaware of this, apart from when one visits a particular friend on the ward. Our visit may make us realise how cut off and anxious a person can be, whether the admission is for a minor medical problem or a serious threat. Multiply that concern by 380 (the number



of beds) and then, in addition, add the stresses and emotional weight carried by the nurses and doctors, and the scale of the issue will soon raise our eyebrows!

Since Covid, the number of volunteer chaplains has dropped drastically. There is such a vacuum of spiritual care, a fact that is so poignant when spiritual care has been emphasised as an essential aspect to medical care: data shows its measurable benefit. Even a couple of hours on the wards with free access to share with any patient can be very rewarding. Sometimes, even a brief moment chatting with a porter or ward clerk is an opportunity to encourage and appreciate them. They so value such moments.
