We begin a new mini-series on Micah. Specifically, Micah 6:8 entitled, "What does the Lord require of you?" Have you ever wondered what it is that God wants you to do? How should you respond to events around you? I know I have. This single verse captures the essence of holy living, pleasing to God. Over the next three weeks, I will be attempting to unpick and unpack the depth of teaching that

this one verse contains. We begin with **Just living or living Justly?** What is justice? What does it mean for us and what does God mean by the word justice? How can we live just lives in a world full of injustice, hatred, violence and corruption? Micah lived in a world not dissimilar to our own and saw the corruption and proclaimed God's judgement, yet at the same time gave us insight into how to live as the Lord requires, to bring about His kingly rule on earth.

Please note that communion, led by Chris Short, will form an integral part of this morning's service, whilst at 6.30pm we have our regular fortnightly Church Prayer Meeting.

Jez Taylor continues with the second of his 3-week series on Micah 6:8. "What does the Lord require of you?"

Prayer Diary 8th – 14th April

The PRAYER FOCUS this week is on certain EASTER CHARACTERS

Monday Joseph of Arimathea, "a respected member of the council". Pray for all who seek to serve Christ and their community in local or national politics. Pray that they might uphold truth and justice, even when it is at variance with their party's politics. Pray for all who serve in national government, remembering those who are undecided as to whether to stand at the next election. Pray that they will be people of honour who can be trusted and that we can once again have faith in elected representatives.

Tuesday <u>Nicodemus</u>, a secret disciple who did what was right. He first came to Jesus by night. Remember those who are unable to nail their colours openly to the Christian mast. Uphold those in countries where freedom of speech is restricted that they might still find a way of standing up for what is right. Remember the many who are part of the "Persecuted Church" overseas, but also those who have been silenced here in the U.K.

Wednesday Mary Magdalene stood weeping, having visited the tomb early on Easter morning. Remember all who have been bereaved recently, those who find it difficult to sleep as a result; those who have been unable to release a loved one to God; those with unresolved issues. The message to Mary was "*He is risen.*" Pray that the reality of the Easter message might bring hope, encouragement, and a way forward for all who are on their grief journey.

Thursday John (the other disciple at the tomb) went in and he saw, and he believed, although he didn't fully understand it. Pray for an enhanced understanding of the wonder of the resurrection, even when this can remain incomplete. Give thanks that Jesus was victorious over sin and death and that they need no longer cause us to be afraid. Pray that the message of a place prepared for us might encourage us to keep looking to Jesus as the author and perfector of our faith and to live in anticipation of all that awaits us there.

Friday <u>Cleopas</u> (and his companion) were returning home on that first Easter Sunday evening. Distressed, despairing, distraught, they confided in the Stranger "we had hoped..." Pray for all who are disillusioned or feel let down by another. Jesus asked "what things?" and was then able to explain clearly from the Scriptures. Pray that, like them, we might feel our hearts burning within us as we allow Him to answer and bring clarity to our doubts and uncertainties. Give thanks for the truths contained in the Bible and pray for all who seek to make clear all the promises contained in its pages.

Saturday <u>Thomas</u>. Give thanks for his honesty, his preparedness to say when matters were unclear. "Unless I see...and have proof" is where many are at just now. Pray that the light and truth of the Gospel will shine brightly on all who have honest doubts and that, like Thomas, they might come to own Him as Lord and God. Pray for many grown up children who have wandered away from a faith they once embraced and confessed, especially remembering the many parents in our church who are constantly prayerful that their children will once again return to the fold.

Sunday Peter. Give thanks for this disciple who, despite making huge mistakes in his life, was lovingly and graciously re-instated by his Master. Give thanks that we, too, can know what it is like to be "ransomed, healed, restored and forgiven". To Christ's question "*Do you love me?*" may we boldly reply "*Yes, Lord, You know that I love You.*" May we know the reality of the fact that we don't have to worry about being left alone ever again. He has promised to stay right here and never leave our side. He will always be with us, even to the very end of time. Join in praise and worship accordingly.
