

Prayer Diary: 8TH – 14TH August

"But let all who take refuge in you be glad, let them ever sing for joy." Psalm 5:11

Monday As you read the above verse, pray today to be filled with God's joy because when you walk through today with childlike delight, savouring every blessing, you proclaim your trust in God, your ever present Shepherd. The joy of the Lord is our strength.

Tuesday Please pray that God will open the eyes of the Russian leadership to see that they are slaves to sin, that they will repent, be put right with God and the whole nation will be changed through the power of the Holy Spirit. God really can move mountains, let's pray for His power to be released and overcome this evil.

Wednesday In many parts of Asia and Africa, Muslim neighbours treat Christians in their villages with extreme cruelty. Please pray that God will be miraculously with Christians through their suffering, and pray that God will reveal Himself to Muslims worldwide so they too may be saved.

Thursday There are many parents in our congregation who now have adult children in their 30's and 40's who were brought up in Sunday school, prayed for and cherished, but have sadly left the church in their adult lives. This is deeply grievous to us older parents and to God who still loves them dearly. Please pray for a huge movement of the Holy Spirit to return these precious ones into His kingdom.

Friday Please pray for all who work at the palace of Westminster, for a complete overhaul of the culture; for a renewed understanding and outworking of the principle of service; for a renewed desire for Christian principles to prevail; and for Christian MP's and leaders in our country.

Saturday Give thanks to God for people you know who are really searching for God. Pray that the Holy Spirit will enable their faith to grow. Please also pray that they will feel comfortable to integrate into a Christian community, not always an easy concept if you have never been to church before.

Sunday "Come Lord Jesus, come Lord Jesus, pour out Your spirit we pray" May God bless, have mercy on, and guide every Christian community around the world today, and may He prepare our hearts to be one with Him to His glory, Amen.

There were three Jewish feasts which were feasts of obligation — Passover, Pentecost and Tabernacles. Every adult male Jew who lived within 15 miles of Jerusalem was legally bound to attend them. In chapter 6, we may think of this feast as Pentecost because the events of

chapter 6: 4 happened when the Passover was in mid-April and Pentecost was seven weeks later. John demonstrates in his gospel Jesus attending the great feasts, for Jesus did not disregard the obligations of Jewish worship. To Jesus it was not a duty, but a delight to worship with His own people.

When Jesus arrived in Jerusalem, He was apparently alone. There is no mention of His disciples. He found His way to a famous pool. Its name was either Bethesda, which translated means House of Mercy, or some manuscripts say Bethzatha which means House of the Olives. The pool was deep enough to swim in. Beneath the pool (300 feet long) was a subterranean stream which every now and again bubbled up and disturbed the waters. The belief was that the disturbance was caused by an angel and that the first person to get into the pool after the bubbling would be healed of any illness from which they were suffering. To us today, this sounds like superstition but to people of Jesus' day, this was believed to be a healing angel!

Ancient people were especially impressed with the holiness of water, for example, rivers and springs. Water was so precious, they were bound to be impressed. Today, we take water for granted – turn on/off the tap - but, in the ancient world, water was so valuable!

In one of the commentaries – a quote from folklore in the Old Testament – when a man was about to ford a river, he should pray and wash his hands "for he who wades through a stream with unwashed hands incurs the wrath of the gods."

Coming back to Jesus as He walked around the pool, His heart must have been touched as He saw the blind, the lame, the severely crippled - what a sight, what a stench of bodies unwashed, lack of toilet facilities — it must have been heartrending, and Jesus picked out the man in our story. Jesus must have selected the most pitiable case. His disability was such that it was unlikely, even

..... impossible, he would ever get into the pool after it had been disturbed. The man did not appear to have any friends to help him. Jesus was always the friend of the friendless. His desire was to help and, yes, heal.

Jesus began by asking the man a question, "Do

you want to be healed?" It was not such a foolish question. This man had waited thirty-eight years. Maybe all hope had died. He must have been in a state of despair. In his heart of hearts, he may have thought that if his situation changed, he would have to think about making a living! But no, this man's response was immediate. He wanted to be healed, though he did not see how it was going to happen since he had nobody to help him.

Jesus told the man to get up. After thirty-eight years, his muscles must have been shrivelled, leaving him with no power in his legs. The power of God never dispenses with the effort of man. He went from a sense of helplessness to standing up for the first time, thanks to the power of Jesus, Jesus, commanding the man to do the impossible.

"Get up. Take up your bed (a simple pallet) and walk!"

Is there a lesson, dear reader? The challenge "Do you want to be healed?" Maybe you have given up. "No-one can help me."

The question is, "Do you want to be healed?" Let the love and power of Jesus come into your life. It is a miracle waiting to happen!
