

CHRISTMAS - No Accident!

A brief reflection on the Birth of Jesus

I sometimes wonder – did all heaven **hold its breath** when Jesus left His glorious
throne and came down, down, down?
Down into the **darkness** of this poor
world. A world created for the glory of
God but ruined by the work of His enemy.
Down to an impoverished world of
darkened minds, and dirt and
degradation, desperately needing a Saviour.



The entrance of Jesus as a babe into a Jewish family in Bethlehem was **no accident**. God the Father had previously planned every detail. He chose ancestry, the mother Mary, the father-figure Joseph, the circumstances, the time, the place, and the manner of the birth through the ministry of the Holy Spirit. He chose the shepherds, the shelter, the star and the far-travelled wise men.

He chose the celebrating choir of angels singing with great joy. The moment of Jesus' arrival here was visibly attested by heaven's representatives. What an astounding angelic welcome and announcement – "A Saviour has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord."

As Saviour, Jesus came to **save** the lost, to **salvage** those on the rubbish heap of humanity. He came to rescue, redeem and restore the image of God on the face of the people whom, He purposed, would one day dwell with Him in peace and purity in His paradise.

Did the angels know what horrors would befall Him as Saviour of mankind? Did they know the darling of heaven would be despised and hated by the people He came to rescue?

Did the shepherds and the wise men bowing down low before the King of the Jews, know He would be **crucified**, suffering punishment for **their sins and ours**, as they worshipped?

We guess they questioned the reason for His coming here, but **we** know the secret – it was no accident - **The Father sent His Son** to be the Saviour of the world. Let us for a moment hold our breath as we contemplate **with awe** the wonderful birth of our Lord; and then lift Him up, up, up with our praises this Christmas.

How to live a wise and Godly life in a sinful world

"Why should you be intoxicated, my son, with a forbidden woman and embrace the bosom of an adulteress? For a man's ways are before the eyes of the Lord, and he ponders all his paths." Prov. 5:20-21

'And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this



down, for these words are trustworthy and true." Revelation 21:2, 5

This is Tim Keller's last introductory sermon to understanding the Book of Proverbs. Chapter 5 deals with adultery but has some important general lessons on how to apply wisdom in a fallen world. The word 'forbidden' used to describe the adulterous woman in Chapter 5:3&20 can be translated 'strange', and is key to understanding this passage. It reminds us God has set physical and spiritual rules for good living, e.g. be honest, be faithful to your spouse, practise generosity, honour your parents, etc., but when we depart from these rules we are deviating, acting strangely from what God intended and it will harm us. We expect, therefore, things to go well when we follow God's rules, and badly if not, as it says in Prov 5:21-23 - "The iniquities of the wicked ensnare him, and he is held fast in the cords of his sin. He dies for lack of discipline, and because of his great folly he is led astray."

But, in practice, that doesn't always happen because we live in a broken world where people do good and are not always rewarded for it or suffer unnecessarily. Jesus Himself lived a perfect life yet He suffered because He was confronted by the fallenness of the world. So where can we find an answer to help us?

We find it in the gospel because Jesus, the Judge alluded to in Proverbs 5:21, came to bear the punishment we deserve. As a result "We can approach the throne of grace with confidence so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Heb. 4:16. Not only that, Jesus covers us with his righteousness. We are the bride coming out of heaven that is 'beautifully adorned' with Christ's righteousness in Revelation 21:2.

How does this truth give us wisdom to live by?

a. It helps us to follow God's rules but not be enslaved by them or fear them. We can appreciate a book like Proverbs better because we realise its sayings are not absolutes, for we live in a fallen world. Like the Sermon on the Mount, we do not see their teaching just as a moral code but something we aim for and need God's help to fulfil.

b. Realising what God has done for us in Christ and what he will do in heaven (Rev.21:1-5) by covering our sin and giving us 'new clothes', we are 'enthralled/intoxicated by Him' (Prov.5:19). This fills us with great love, joy and peace to help us put things in perspective, cope with disappointments and live a balanced life.



As Mathew Arnold put it, 'He saw life steady and saw it whole' or better still, we can say with Paul, 'I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want.' Phil. 4:12
