

Prayer Diary: 9TH- 15TH May

Monday 2 Chronicles 16:9 "For the eyes of the LORD range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to Him." We can praise God that we are never out of His sight, but can always draw on His strength if we are fully committed to Him. Let us pray for those who might be unsure of their level of commitment.

Tuesday 1 John 2:5 "But if anyone obeys His word, love for God is truly made complete in them. This is how we know we are in Him: whoever claims to live in Him must live as Jesus did. Jesus lived." Jesus, who is our Saviour, and greatest teacher, lived in total communion with His Father, as well as in total obedience to God and His word. Let us ask Him where we fall short of His standards, and ask that our Heavenly Father helps us grow more like Jesus in communion with, and obedience to, Him.

Wednesday Galatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law." Pray for all the Christian groups that meet in our buildings. Pray that the leaders demonstrate this fruit to those who attend, and pray for those — young and old — who belong to the organisations or groups, pray they come to know Jesus as Saviour and grow this fruit in their lives too.

Thursday 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline." Thank God for the pastors and team in Lebedyn, and other Christians in Ukraine who demonstrate their self-discipline, love and the power of God in tumultuous situations. Pray for their continued safety, health and strength. Please ask God that all provisions needed should arrive in time. Also pray for those whose faith has been sorely tested by the awful suffering some are enduring. Pray too for any Russian Christians who are struggling.

Friday 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God." Let us pray for all we know in our own friends or family who need comforting. Let us also remember before God any we know in the family of God who have such needs too, thanking Him for the comfort we have received when we needed it, and asking God's help to share our testimony as/ when appropriate to encourage others.

Saturday Psalm 132:13-14 (Amplified Bible) "For the Lord has chosen Zion, He has desired it for His habitation: This is My resting-place forever [says the Lord]; here will I dwell, for I have desired it." As those Jews in Israel, and around the world, gather around the scriptures, pray that they will have their eyes opened to the truth about their Jewish Messiah. Currently, an Imam has called for the destruction of Israel before 8th July. Please pray.

Sunday Psalm 145 "I will exalt You, my God the King; I will praise Your name for ever and ever. Every day I will praise You and extol Your name for ever and ever." Please praise and exalt our wonderful, gracious Heavenly Father. If stuck for words, open Psalm 145 and let it lead you into praise and worship, or just read it out loud to the Lord.

On holiday recently a friend reminded me of that delightful text in Thessalonians, "In everything give thanks".


Well, I suppose that's alright in a perfect world when the sun
