Let us pray for situations around the world.

We ask forgiveness for the way in which we have developed at the expense of others. We ask that peace will be restored in Ukraine and continue in Gaza. Help us to look outwards and see that many folk around the world do not have the education, healthcare and services that we enjoy. We pray that barriers will be dissolved to realise that You alone are Sovereign.

**Saturday** Cold places – For the beauty and majesty of the Antarctic and Arctic we thank you, Lord. Help us Father God to look to these wildernesses not as opportunity but as evidence of Your great goodness and powerful creation. Help us to see how beauty and danger, desolation and wonder coexist in this world. Let us see Your provision, Your perfect plan and let these places serve as hope on this earth.

**Sunday** Our own islands and town - God of Heaven we give thanks for our home and all the blessings we have in this country. We pray for our streets, the Downs and neighbourhoods here in Eastbourne and for places further afield. We pray for our schools, hospitals and our government. We pray for the people in towns and cities who are struggling to provide for their families. We lay before You the crisis of mental health that is evident everywhere and pray for people who are in despair: help us to see with Your eyes, Lord and to speak Your love into the situations we come across.

# Seeing Christ in the Book of Proverbs

(with the help of Tim Keller) Part 6 Dealing with Anger

One of the subjects Proverbs deals with that causes much trouble and harm in the world is anger. To be wise therefore means we must learn to control it. Here are some Biblical principles found in Proverbs and the rest of scripture to help us.

1. Uncontrolled anger hurts our health. communities, ability to make good choices and our outlook on life. It is like a drug addiction and can get out of control. "Whoever is patient has great



understanding, but one who is quick-tempered displays folly. A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones" (Prov.14:29-30).

2. Wrong anger is caused when our ego and pride are hurt and we turn good desires into ultimate ones, places only God should occupy - eg we get angry with someone who embarrasses us because we have made the desire to be popular key to our happiness, as Haman did with Mordecai in the Book of Esther 3:1-6.

3. What is misunderstood and surprising about anger is that it is basically a good attribute that is misused. In the Bible, anger is a characteristic of God and Godly people - eg 'God is angry with the wicked every day (Ps7:11). In the New Testament Jesus was angry with the greedy money changers in the temple, He was angry with death at Lazarus' grave (Jn. 11:33), Paul was angry with false teachers disrupting the church eg Gal. 5:12. There is a righteous anger that springs from love and wants to defend those we care for, who are under threat. In fact, an absence of righteous anger or an indifference to unjust situations or wrongdoing, eg exploitation of vulnerable people or failing to discipline our children when they do wrong, suggests a lack of true love!

What we must learn therefore is to control our anger. Not, as sometimes taught, by giving vent to it or, the opposite, trying to stifle it. Both are wrong and lead to misery. The wise and Biblical way is 'to be slow to anger' and follow God's example (Ps.103:8, Prov.15:18) and Paul's instruction to 'Be angry and sin not' Eph.4:26

5. How then can we be slow to anger?

- a. Don't hide it but admit it is there.
- b. Analyse it by talking to yourself about it as Solomon instructs us. 'Do not say, "I will do to him as he has done to me; I will pay the man back for what he has done" (Prov.24:29). The Bible often uses that approach when we face difficulties. Realise that most things on reflection are NOT WORTH GETTING ANGRY ABOUT.

c. Lastly, learn how, with God's help, you can transform a hurtful situation into a triumph by remembering what Christ did for you and following His example. At one time we turned our backs on God, were against Him and He, the innocent one, 'went like a lamb to the slaughter', onto the cross on our behalf. What did He do there? He didn't retaliate or get angry with mankind but, instead, cried, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).That is why in Proverbs and other places in the Bible we are told, "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (Prov.15:1). "If your enemy is hungry, give him bread to eat, and if he is thirsty, give him water to drink, for you will heap burning coals on his head, and the Lord will reward you" (Prov.25:21-22). We need to distinguish between the sin and the sinner and insist on the way of truth and love without paying back. God give us grace to do so.
