

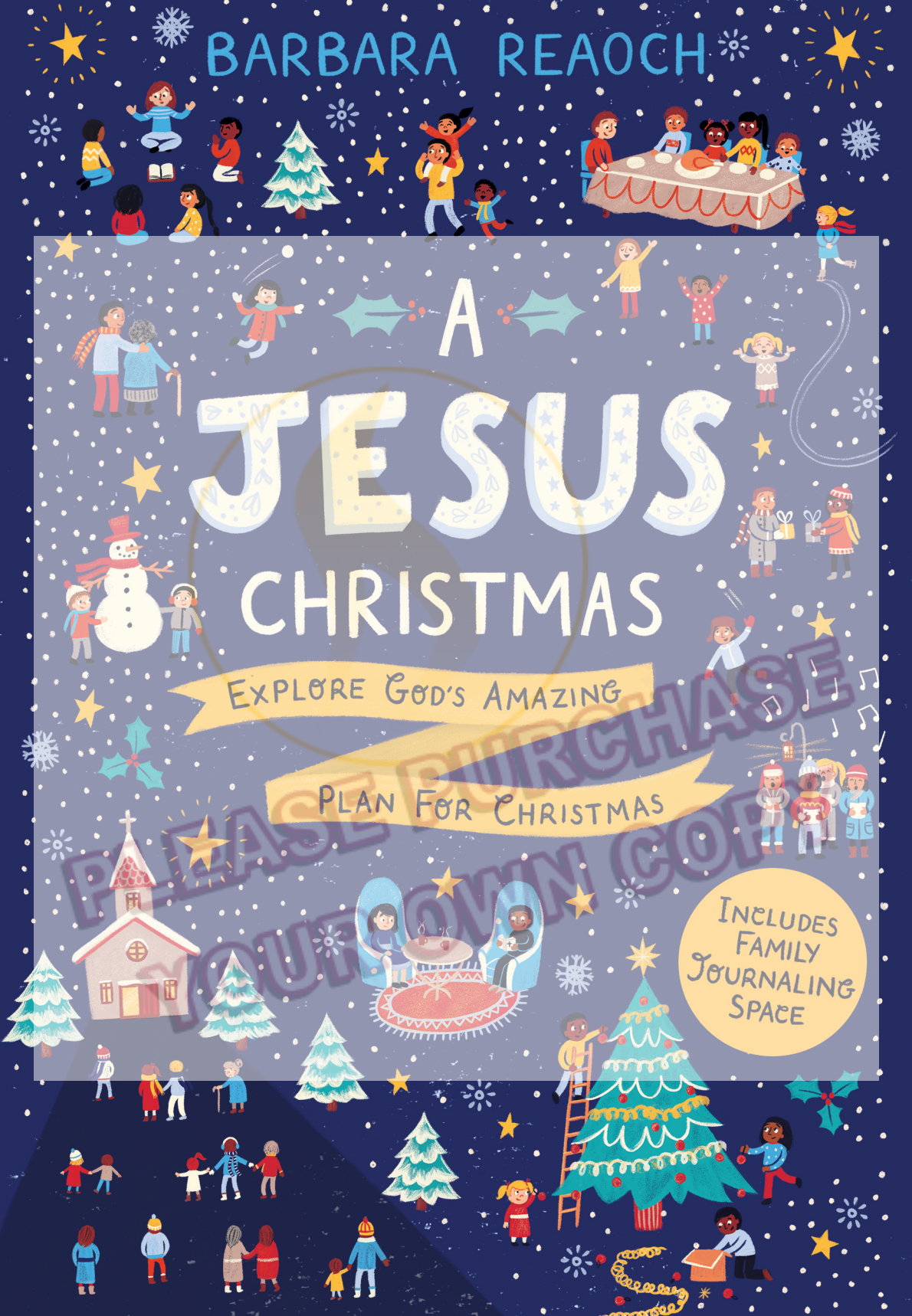

BEFORE YOU BEGIN



These devotions are ideal for all ages. They are about faith—trusting Jesus, not your own goodness. They are about repentance—living for Jesus, not yourself. They are for children who already believe and for those who do not yet believe in Jesus. We all need encouragement all the time to believe Jesus’s truth.

Prepare your own heart before you lead your family or others in *A Jesus Christmas*. Ask your heavenly Father to guide you. Ask for insight about what questions to ask and how to promote discussion. Pray for God to give you a daily desire to make Jesus the focus of this Christmas.

THE DAILY PATTERN

Each day has four parts: Explore, Explain, Engage, and Enter in. These are followed by a wonderful true statement about Jesus and some family journaling space.

EXPLORE

Reading the Bible passage together is the key activity. The Bible will connect these true stories to show us God’s plan for sending Jesus. His big picture will come into view as you start to see these themes emerge:

- God’s plan for sending Jesus started in the Garden of Eden.
- Satan (the devil) was seen in the garden as a serpent/snake. Adam and Eve listened to the serpent’s lie. Their sin broke everything in God’s perfect world.
- Instead of running to God, we all run from him.
- God loves us more than we know. He promised to send his Son, Jesus, to crush the serpent and destroy evil.

- God planned for Jesus to come through the family line of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Ruth, and David.
- The serpent tells many lies but Jesus always tells the truth.
- Jesus lived and died for us to free us from the serpent's lies so that we can come to God as our Father.
- All who receive the gift of Jesus are God's children and will live with him forever.

EXPLAIN

Each day three things are highlighted: God's plan for Jesus, the serpent's lies, and Jesus's truth. Try to answer your child's questions but don't get bogged down in details. Assure everyone that as they learn more about Jesus, the truths will start to connect.

ENGAGE

There are two Engage questions for older children. The first helps children discover how truth intersects with their lives. The second question stimulates deeper discussion.

Each Engage question also has a simpler version after it. This is ideal for younger children or those with less Bible knowledge. The older and younger questions are marked as shown below:

For younger children

Be prepared to get the conversation going. Ask God for willingness to talk about times when you are tempted to sin. Pray that you will respond to your kids with understanding and not in a judgmental tone. As your family responds honestly to God's word and Spirit, they will begin to treasure the truth of Jesus.

ENTER IN

This short prayer is a springboard for your response to whatever God shows you about himself, Jesus, and yourself. The journal notes you make will continue to remind you of how God has used his Spirit and his word to work eternal miracles in your family.

JESUS IS...

These "Jesus is..." statements will help your family to remember that Christmas is about Jesus. Some have been decorated for you, though your child may want to add extra stars and patterns. Others have letter outlines for your child to color in.

FAMILY JOURNALING SPACE

This is a place to respond to what God has shown you. You might want to write down what you have learned, draw a picture, list things to thank God for, draw how your face looks when you think about Jesus, or use this space for any other way you want to respond to God. There is some extra journaling space at the back of the book for any days when you have an idea that needs more room.

TIPS FOR SUCCESS

Be brief. Be real. Be consistent.

SOME USEFUL BIBLE WORDS



AMEN: This Hebrew word means “I agree.” It is a way of joining in with someone’s prayer.

BIBLE / SCRIPTURE / GOD’S BOOK: Although the Bible was written by about 40 people, God made sure that they wrote exactly what he wanted them to write. God speaks to us through the Bible, and what he says in the Bible is always true.

CHRISTMAS: We don’t know exactly when Jesus was born, but December 25th was chosen as a day to celebrate Christmas—the birth of Jesus Christ.

FULFILLED: When one of God’s promises is fulfilled, it means that he has done exactly what he promised to do. When Jesus was born at the very first Christmas, he fulfilled many of God’s promises.

ISRAEL / ISRAELITES / GOD’S CHILDREN: God promised Abraham that his family would be so huge that counting them would be like trying to count all of the stars. This family were God’s people, often known as the Israelites or simply Israel. God promised that his rescuing King would come from this family.

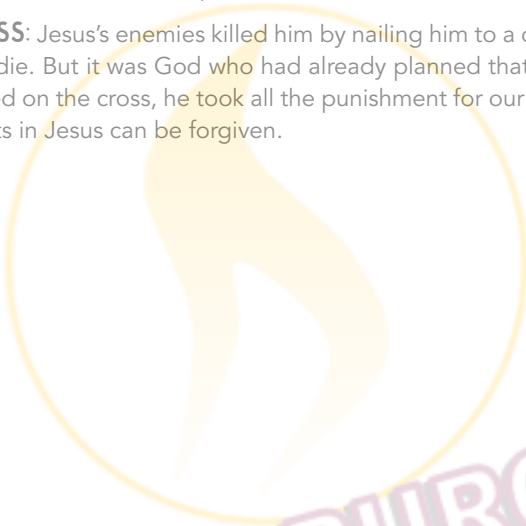
MERCY: Mercy is when God doesn’t treat us in the way we deserve. Instead God shows us grace, which is his huge kindness to people who don’t deserve it.

MESSIAH / CHRIST: "Messiah" is a Hebrew word. The same word in Greek is "Christ." They both mean "the anointed one." When someone became king, they were anointed with oil. The names Messiah and Christ tell us that Jesus is God's chosen King.

SERPENT: In the Garden of Eden, Satan (the devil) was seen as a serpent/snake.

SIN / SINFUL: When we sin, we do what **we** want instead of what **God** wants. In our hearts we believe the lies of the serpent more than we believe God. Jesus came to rescue us from the problem of sin.

THE CROSS: Jesus's enemies killed him by nailing him to a cross and leaving him there to die. But it was God who had already planned that Jesus would die. As Jesus died on the cross, he took all the punishment for our sin, so that everyone who trusts in Jesus can be forgiven.

EXPLORE

Read Genesis 3 v 1-5 and 14-15

What lie did the serpent tell Adam and Eve? (verses 4-5)

What did God tell the serpent? (verses 14-15)

EXPLAIN

God's plan for the first Christmas starts right at the beginning of the Bible. God built a beautiful garden for Adam and Eve's home. He talked with them like best friends talk, and gave them lots of delicious fruit to eat. God loved Adam and Eve so much that he warned them not to eat the fruit of one tree. They would die if they ate that fruit.

But a serpent in the garden (who was really Satan) told them God had lied. The serpent said they couldn't trust what God said. Was the serpent telling the truth? No! God *always* speaks what is true. Sadly, Adam and Eve believed the serpent

and ate the fruit. Now weeds grow and God's creatures die. Worse yet, the terrible lie of the serpent lives on in every human heart. Instead of running to God, we run from him.

God loved Adam and Eve so much more than they thought. Adam's and Eve's sin broke everything. But God made the best-ever promise! **God promised to send someone to crush the serpent and destroy evil.** That someone is Jesus.

ENGAGE

★ Why do we run away from God instead of to him?

★ Ever since Adam and Eve believed the serpent, what lives in our hearts?

★ What makes God's promise of Jesus the very best promise ever?

★ What promise did God give to Adam and Eve and us all?

ENTER IN

God, you are our good Father. Thank you for your promise to send Jesus. We want to learn what it means to run to you and stop running from you. Help us know you and love you more this Christmas and always. Amen.

LIKE THE STARS IN THE SKY



EXPLORE

Read Genesis 15 v 1-6

What did God promise Abram? (verses 4-5)

How did Abram respond to God's promise? (verse 6)

EXPLAIN

Christmas is God's answer to our biggest problem. God promised to send Jesus to rescue us from the serpent's terrible lie in our hearts. But *how* would God send Jesus?

God told a man named Abram, "Do not be afraid. I am your great reward." God promised him a son. Did Abram hear this right? He and his wife, Sarai, were too old to have a baby. Then God told him something even more amazing: "Look up into the night sky and count the stars." Abram would have as many children as there are stars. And from Abram's son's son's son's ... son the Rescuer would come.

Abram believed God. He did not listen to the serpent's lie that says, "You have to see it *before* you can believe it." The truth is, we see the truth when we believe in Jesus. God gives us hearts that can see. Jesus is the Rescuer—who lived all his perfect life for us. And Jesus died for every wrong thing we do. **Jesus rescues everyone who believes in him.**

ENGAGE

ENTER IN

Father God, you are powerful. Thank you for making it possible for Abram to believe you and your promise to him. Please take away our unbelief. Give us new hearts to believe you and your promise of Jesus. Amen.

A PROMISED CHILD



EXPLORE

Read Genesis 21 v 1-6

What did God give to Abraham and Sarah, just as he promised? (verses 1-2)

How did Sarah react to having a son? (verse 6)

EXPLAIN

Christmas is God's way of saying, "I always keep my promises." God promised to make Abraham the father of many children. Best of all, one of his son's son's son's ... sons would be Jesus! But when no son was born, the terrible lie of the serpent made him wonder, "How can I be sure God will keep his promise?"

When Sarah heard God's promise to give her a child, she laughed (Genesis 18 v 12). After all, what does a pregnant 90-year-old look like?! But, nine months later, Sarah gave birth to a baby boy. They named him *Isaac*, which means "son of laughter." Sarah laughed again, this time from a heart of joy.

Christmas tells us that Jesus is God's "YES" to all of his promises. When God came out of heaven, in Jesus, he proved that all of his promises are true. Jesus's joy fills our hearts when we believe in him. The joy of a Christmas gift lasts only a short time. But the joy Jesus puts in our hearts lasts forever. **Jesus is real joy!**

ENGAGE

★ For every day to seem like Christmas, we would need gifts and special treats every day. Why does the joy from a Christmas gift last only a short time?

★ How do we know God always keeps his promises?

★ The lasting joy we all really want comes from Jesus. Have you told him, "Jesus, I trust you as my Rescuer; you alone can give me a new heart and a new life with you forever"?

★ How long does the joy that Jesus gives us last?

ENTER IN

God, you are the Promise-Keeper. You have the power to keep all your promises. Please give us the forever joy of trusting Jesus as our Rescuer. Amen.

EXPLORE

Read Genesis 28 v 10-17

What did Jacob see in his dream? (verse 12)

What did God promise Jacob? (verses 13-15)

EXPLAIN

God's plan for the first Christmas included an unlikely guy named Jacob. Abraham's grandsons, Jacob and Esau, were twins. Jacob tricked his brother and lied to his father, Isaac. Jacob messed up a lot and knew his father loved Esau more. But God chose Jacob. God would send Jesus to bless the world through Jacob's family.

The terrible lie of the serpent whispers, "You haven't kept your promises to God—how will he keep his promise to you?" The truth is, Jesus came to rescue promise-breakers like Jacob. In a dream, God showed Jacob a stairway with

angels going up and down from heaven to earth. God came to Jacob. Jacob did not have to climb the stairway to God.

Christmas tells us that Jesus **is** the Stairway (John 1 v 51). God didn't send Jesus to help us be strong enough to climb up to him. God loves us so much that Jesus came down to get us. God's rescue plan is better than we could ever dream. We don't have to rescue ourselves... **Jesus takes us to God.**

Father God, you are always right and just. We're amazed that you know we mess up and yet you love us. Thank you for sending Jesus to be strong for us. Help us rest in your great love. Amen.

THE ONLY TRULY GOOD PERSON



EXPLORE

Read Exodus 3 v 4-10

Why did Moses need to take off his sandals? (verses 5-6)

Why was God sending Moses to Egypt? (verses 8-10)

EXPLAIN

Moses was part of God's plan for the first Christmas. The family of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob grew into a very big family called Israel. But something was terribly wrong. God's people—often called God's children—were slaves! They lived far away in a place called Egypt. God sent Moses to lead his people. Moses loved God and was a good person. Moses would rescue God's children from slavery. But he could not crush the head of the serpent.

The serpent whispers, "Any good person could rescue you." The truth is, no matter how good or wise, all teachers and leaders are sinful. Jesus is the only

truly good Teacher and Leader. The serpent tempted Jesus, but Jesus won every fight against sin. Only Jesus never sinned, so only Jesus can rescue us.

Christmas tells us that Jesus is much more than a good person—he is fully God and fully human. Only Jesus can bring us to God. God's Book, the Bible, says, "Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself" (Hebrews 3 v 3). **Jesus is our only way to God.**

ENGAGE

★ Why is Jesus the only one who can rescue us?

★ Who is the only one that can rescue us?

★ Christmas is mostly fun, but problems happen. When you speak mean words and you sin, how can Jesus be your Rescuer? (Adults, share honestly about your own need, to get the discussion going.)

★ How is Jesus different from every other good person?

ENTER IN

Father God, you have a big plan for your people. Jesus, help us remember how powerful you are. Please use your perfect strength to rescue us from impatience and worry. We want you to be at the center of this Christmas and not us. Amen.

THE PASSOVER LAMB



EXPLORE

Read Exodus 12 v 21-27

The leaders of Israel were also called elders. What instructions did Moses give to them? (verses 21-23)

What did God's people tell their children about Passover? (verses 26-27)

EXPLAIN

The miracle of Christmas was coming. But God's people were still slaves in Egypt. Had God forgotten them? No! To help them wait for the first Christmas, God gave them pictures of what Jesus would be like. The first picture was the Passover lamb (1 Corinthians 5 v 7). Jesus the Lamb was coming.

God warned the Egyptians how bad sin is. But they listened to the serpent whisper, "God won't really punish anyone." The truth is, sin hurts us and everyone. So God's love for all people means he must punish sin. God lovingly

planned a way to punish evil and forgive his children at the same time. God punished evil in all of Egypt. But the lamb's blood on the door-frames kept his people safe inside their houses.

Christmas tells us Jesus is the Lamb (John 1 v 29). Jesus never sinned, but he took the punishment for sin that we deserve. When Jesus hung on the cross, his body was broken and his blood poured out, to keep us safe with God. God's greatest gift to you is his only Son. **Jesus rescues us from God's punishment for sin.**

ENGAGE



Why is it good to see how bad sin is?



The Bible calls Jesus the Lamb. Why?



Imagine this: When a fire came, a mother bird covered her chicks with her body to keep them safe. She died but the fire did not touch the chicks. Punishment for sin will be like a deadly fire. How does knowing Jesus as your Passover Lamb help you know you are safe from sin's punishment?



What is God's plan to punish evil and forgive his people at the same time?

ENTER IN

Father God, you are right and just. Your warnings come from your heart of love. Please help us replace the lies that we've believed about sin with your truth. Thank you for sending Jesus to be our Passover Lamb. Amen.

LIFE-GIVING BREAD



EXPLORE

Read Exodus 16 v 1-5 and 31

Why did the people grumble? (verses 1-3)

What did the people call the bread God gave them to eat? (verse 31)

EXPLAIN

How hard it was to wait for the first Christmas! On the long walk to their new home, God gave his children a second picture of Jesus—manna, the special bread with which he fed them. Their tummies were full but their hearts didn't see the picture of Jesus. All they could think about was the food they missed and how hard this new life was.

The serpent's terrible lie asks, "Is life with God really better than life without him?" The truth is, life with God is the only way to true happiness. God made us for himself. We may hunger for money, friends, talents, looking good and being smart. but only God fills our hearts and truly satisfies. Jesus, the Bread of Life, fills us up with his life.

Christmas tells us that Jesus is the true Manna (John 6 v 31-35). Bread fills our stomachs, but Jesus fills our hearts. The taste of Jesus in your heart is so much sweeter than freshly baked bread in your mouth. **Jesus fills our hearts with his life.**

ENGAGE

★ How is Jesus the only way to true happiness?

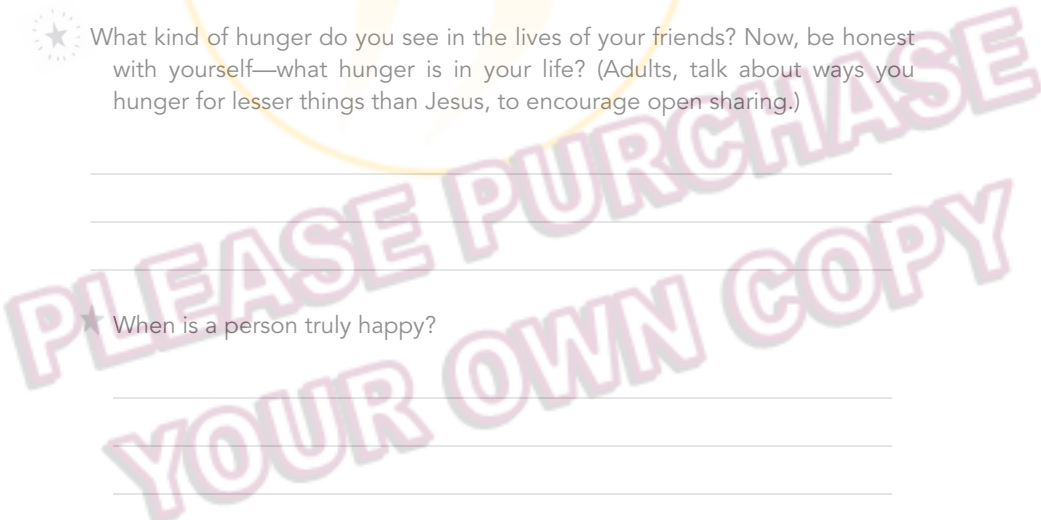
★ Why is Jesus the Bread of life?

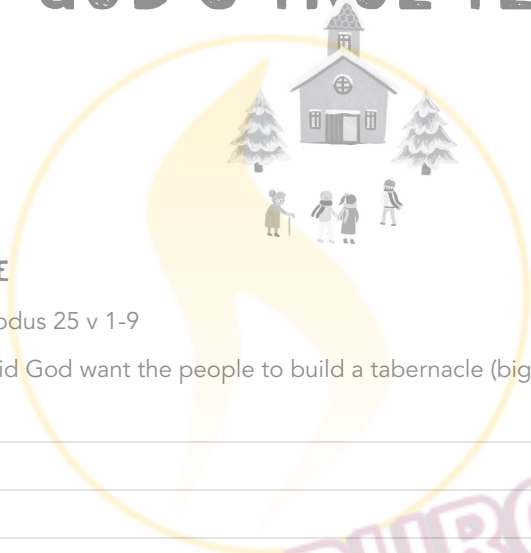

EXPLAIN

Why was the first Christmas taking so long? On the long walk to their new home, God gave his children a third picture of Jesus. God loved his children so much that he made his home right in the middle of their neighborhood. God's big, beautiful tent was his new home.

Adam and Eve had once lived with God. They walked and talked with God as best friends do. But after Adam and Eve believed the serpent's lie, they ran and hid from God. Now the serpent whispers, "God lives so far away. Does he really

love you?" The truth is God has always loved us so much more than we think. He showed his love by sending Jesus. Jesus is God's true Tent (John 1 v 14).

Christmas tells us that Jesus came to make his home in our hearts. Jesus is so close to his people that he even hears what they think. And he sees everything. Not even a hair falls from your head unless it is in his good plan for you. **Jesus came to make your heart his home.**

The serpent whispers, "Only good people are in God's family." The truth is, God adopts everyone into his family who turns from the serpent's lies and trusts in Jesus. God is not ashamed to call you his child whether you belong to a good family or feel that you don't belong at all. Ruth chose to believe God.

Christmas tells us that all who trust in Jesus are God's children. Ruth's name is right there in Jesus's family tree (Matthew 1 v 5). Ruth married Boaz, a man from Abraham's family. Even more amazing, their son Obed was King David's grandfather. But most amazing of all, Ruth's son's son's son's ... son was Jesus. **Anyone who turns from sin and trusts in Jesus is God's child.**

ENGAGE

★ Who can become a child in God's family?

★ Who did Ruth choose to believe, and who was her son's son's son's ... son?

★ When you are in a new school or neighborhood, Christmas can be hard. Who do you know who might feel that they don't belong? How could you show them that Jesus's love includes them?

★ Who does God adopt into his family?

ENTER IN

God told David, "Actually, I'm going to build a house for you. Not a house of wood and stone, but a family with a son

who will be a king forever." From then on, God's children knew King David's son's son's son's ... son would be God's promised forever King. That means Jesus!

Christmas tells us that Jesus is God's King who rules forever. The angel announced, "He will be great ... the Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign ... forever; his kingdom will never end" (Luke 1 v 32-33). **Jesus is the King that God promised to send.**

Christmas tells us Jesus was born to live for us. Jesus lived all his perfect life for us. He gives strength to all who run to him for help. **Jesus was tempted in every way and never sinned.**

The serpent whispers, "Did Jesus really have to die?" The truth is, the whole world broke when Adam and Eve listened to the serpent. Only Jesus could crush the serpent and destroy evil and death. Through his death, Jesus broke the serpent's power over us.

A JESUS CHRISTMAS

Christmas tells us that Jesus was born to die for us. "Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil" (Hebrews 2 v 14). **Jesus died to set us free.**

ENGAGE

- ★ When Jesus died it seemed that the serpent had won. Why was it God's plan for Jesus to die?

- ★ How is Jesus different from other kings?

- ★ Jesus frees us from the devil's power and gives us strength to fight against sin (John 8 v 34-36). If you are God's child, talk about a time when you were tempted to sin and Jesus gave you power to say "No." (Adults, to get the discussion going, share honestly.)

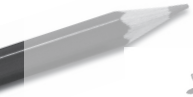

And no matter how hard we try, we can't make ourselves good enough. God didn't send a good teacher or prophet to tell us what to do. Only Jesus could take the full and right anger of God against sin. "The Son is the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1 v 15). **Jesus is God with us.**

What are you learning about Jesus that is making your love for him grow?



How is Jesus different from other good teachers?

Christmas tells us that Jesus forgives our sins and gives us joy. To repent is more than saying "sorry." It is Jesus helping us to love him more than our sin. Jesus helps us to turn around and run to God. **Jesus is the Path to forgiveness and joy.**

ENGAGE

★ A home may look clean until sunshine streams in, showing the dirt and dust. And our lives may look clean until God's light shines in. What "dirt and dust" in your life is God showing you? Will you admit your sin to God? (Adults, talk about what God is showing you, to encourage open sharing.)

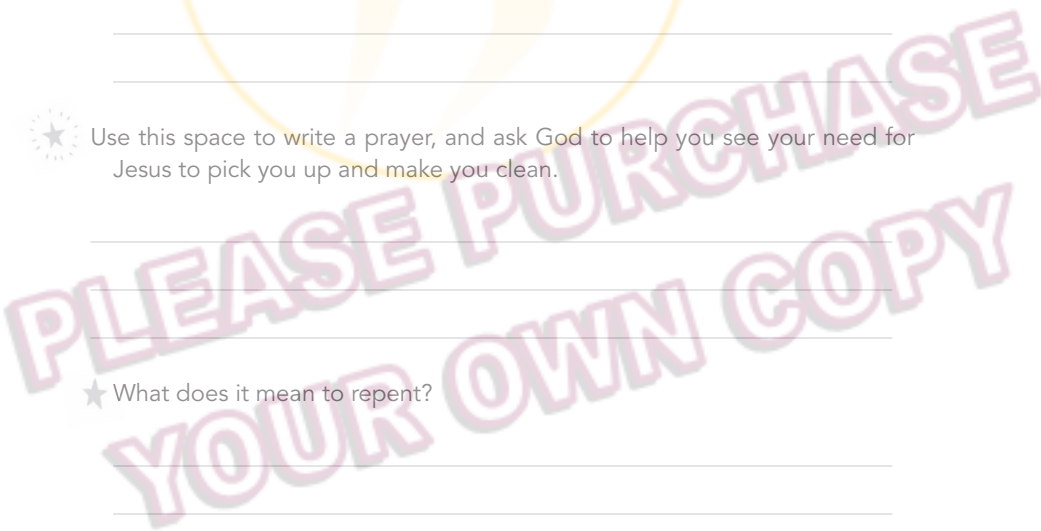

"The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah, and he will reign for ever and ever" (Revelation 11 v 15). **Jesus is real and he is coming again.**

ENGAGE



Faith doesn't mean wishing that everything turns out okay. Faith in Jesus is trusting truth. How does knowing that Jesus really lived, died, and came back to life help you know for sure that he is coming again?



How do we know the story of Jesus is real?

The serpent's lie says that God loves only certain kinds of people. The truth is, God loves people who are rich and poor, good and bad, smart and not so smart. God loves people of every nation, color, and language.

Christmas tells us that Jesus came for all people. You may be young or old, very important or ignored by others. You may know a lot or not yet be able to read. None of these things matter to God. The angels shouted out their joyful message to *all* people: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." **Jesus came for you.**

ENGAGE

(Psalm 119 v 103) When we hear or read the Bible, the Holy Spirit makes God's words sweet to us. In God's Book we hear the sweetest name of all—Jesus.

Christmas tells us that the words about Jesus in God's Book are true. Everything the shepherds saw was just as they had been told. Mary didn't just listen; she "treasured" and "pondered" what she heard. She thought about God's truth long and hard to get all the sweetness out that she could. **God's Book is all about Jesus.**

EXPLAIN

God's plan for Christmas included an old man named Simeon. For Simeon's whole life, he had believed God's promises to Abraham. He had prayed for King David's son's son's son's ... son to come and save God's people from the serpent's lies. God gave Simeon a special promise—he would see the Rescuer before he died.

The day had come! When Joseph and Mary brought baby Jesus into the temple, Simeon saw that this baby was the Rescuer. He knew he could die in peace. "For my eyes have seen your salvation," he said. The serpent whispers, "Why do you need to be saved? You are better than most people." The truth is that the

terrible lies of the serpent live in every human heart. Even the good things we do are stained by sin.

Christmas tells us that Jesus saves us from sin's punishment and power. Jesus's name means, "He will save us from our sins." Everyone who trusts Jesus is rescued from their sin and welcomed into God's family. **Jesus sets us free from sin to live for him.**

ENGAGE

★ If we compare ourselves with others we might say, "Bad people may need Jesus, but I'm pretty good." What is the truth about our sin and Jesus's rescue?

★ What special promise did God give to Simeon?

★ Have you heard these lies? "Don't worry about sin—God is happy with what you do for him." / "Everybody does some bad things, but when you do, you make up by doing good things." / "Little sins aren't that bad—just tell God you're sorry." What lies does the serpent whisper to you about your sin? What is the truth?

★ What did Simeon know when he saw baby Jesus?

ENTER IN

Father God, your kindness is so amazing! Thank you for sending Jesus to save us because we could never save ourselves. Help us see what lies we believe about our sin. And Jesus, please set us free from sin. We want to live for you! Amen.

EXPLORE

Read Luke 2 v 36-39

What did Anna do all day, every day? (verse 37)

How did God show Anna that he had answered her prayers? (verse 38)

EXPLAIN

Anna was part of God's plan for Christmas. Anna was very old. She loved God and believed his promise to send the Rescuer. Her hope, like Eve's, was for the Rescuer to come and crush the serpent's head. She longed for Abraham's son's son's son's ... son to come and bless the world. Anna prayed every day that God would send Jesus.

The serpent whispers, "Why pray if God already knows what he is going to do?" The truth is, God uses our prayers to bring about his will, the things he has decided will happen (Isaiah 37 v 21-22, 26). Jesus told us to pray for God's will to be done. He allows us to be part of his work, which will go on forever (Matthew 6 v 9-10). God's children can talk with him like best friends talk.

Christmas tells us we should pray for what God has promised. We know that everything Anna had prayed for was right there in front of her, because her

prayers all became thanksgiving and praise. When God's children pray in Jesus's name, we can expect God to hear us. **God hears our prayers because of Jesus.**

ENGAGE



How do you need God's help today? Will you pray right now for his help? You don't need any special words. Just come to God through faith in Jesus and he will hear you.



What did Anna pray for every day?



Who in your life needs to know about God's love? Pray right now for this person and ask God to give you a way to love them this week.



What is talking to God like for God's children?

ENTER IN

Father God, you are powerful and make everything happen. Thank you for sending Jesus and inviting us to talk to you about anything. We admit that we often live life without praying. Please sound an alarm in our hearts to remind us of how good it is to talk with you. And open our eyes to see what you do! Amen.

THE TRUTH ABOUT JESUS



EXPLORE

Read Matthew 2 v 1-6

The Magi are sometimes called wise men. What did they know about Jesus?
(verse 2)

How did people find out where God planned for Jesus to be born? (verses 4-6)

EXPLAIN

The Magi's first Christmas started when they saw a new star shining far away over Israel. A king was born! They were not yet God's children but they wanted to know the truth. They packed their bags and left for Jerusalem. But no one in Jerusalem knew about any baby. Finally, people looked in God's Book. They learned that God's true King would be born in Bethlehem.

The serpent whispers, "What is truth?" The truth is that *Jesus* is truth. Jesus said, "The reason I was born and came into the world was to testify (be a witness) to the truth" (John 18 v 37). We can see lies better when we know the truth.

Christmas tells us that Jesus is the greatest truth of all. The stars and all of nature show that God is real but they cannot tell us the greatest truth. God's Book tells us that *Jesus* made all stars and trees and creatures (John 1 v 1, 3). When the Magi arrived "they bowed down and worshiped him" (Matthew 2 v 11). They knew Jesus was the King of kings. **Jesus speaks truth and is truth.**

ENGAGE



The Magi left home on a long journey to find the new King. In Jerusalem they finally learned from God's Book the truth about Jesus. How has reading God's Book helped you see the truth, and the lies people believe?

★ What did the Magi find out about Jesus?

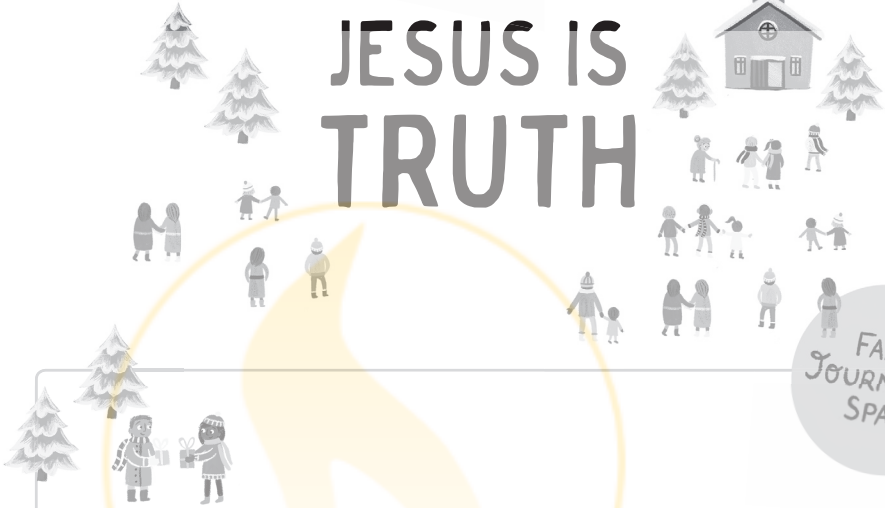

Read Matthew 2 v 7-8 and 16-18

What reason did Herod give the Magi for wanting to know more about Jesus?
(verse 8)

How did Herod react when he discovered the Magi had outwitted him? (verse 16)

EXPLAIN

Herod didn't like the first Christmas. He was afraid of Jesus. Herod did not want to lose his little kingdom. He could have given his life to God's great King. Instead, Herod tried to kill Jesus. He failed, but his soldiers killed every baby boy around Bethlehem under the age of two.

The serpent whispers, "Why would God allow this to happen?" The truth is, all bad things started in the garden, when Adam and Eve believed the serpent's lie. Sin broke God's perfect world. Now all people are born broken. Herod's awful sin

killed the boys. But when God allows something bad to happen, he uses it for good (Romans 8 v 28-32). Jesus's death was wicked, but through the cross he rescues us from sin and death. Now we can be God's children forever.

Christmas tells us that Jesus came to win over sin and death. When Jesus died on the cross, the serpent thought he had won. But Jesus rose to life. He crushed the serpent. Herod and all God's enemies will one day stand before his judgment throne. **Jesus came to right every wrong.**

What hard things that have happened to you, or a friend, will you ask God to use for good?

EXPLORE

Read John 1 v 1-5 and 9-14 (In these verses Jesus is called "the Word". So, as you read, say "Jesus" each time instead of "the Word".)

Who is the true light that came to shine light into the dark world? (verses 5 and 9-10)

What right does Jesus give to all who believe in him? (verse 12)

EXPLAIN

God's plan for Christmas is Jesus! Jesus is the true Light. He rescues us from darkness. Even the brightest Christmas lights cannot give true light to our minds and hearts. Jesus promises, "Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8 v 12).

The serpent whispers, "You have enough light to find your way." The truth is, ever since the serpent's lie, darkness has come upon God's perfect world. Adam's and Eve's sin broke the light switch. In the darkness, we cannot see to find our way to become God's children.

Christmas tells us that Jesus is the Light. He fixes the switch and gives us light to trust God and believe his Book. Jesus's light pushes back the darkness. We don't have to believe the serpent's lies any more. We can see that Jesus is the greatest gift of all. "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made his light shine in our hearts" (2 Corinthians 4 v 6). **Jesus gives light and life.**

ENGAGE



Christmas is all about Jesus. Will you begin the greatest celebration of all by asking Jesus to shine his light into your mind and heart? Will you receive God's gift of Jesus and become a child of God?
